sugar factory, no one place on this coast can offer greater and more numerous natural advantages.

According to tests made during the last few years, the Rogue river valley produces beets which give up the highest percentage of saccharine matter. This soil of decomposed granite is warm, easily worked, and contains just the right element for the growth and development of the sugar beet. With irrigation as a safeguard against drouth, there would never occur a failure of the crop.

Every material is at hand for both building and operating a beet factory. Granite for the walls, lime and marble, pure water, etc.

As a place for operative to live, the Rogue river valley is without a superior anywhere. Its climate, scenery and products give it the name Italy of Oregon.

ANOTHER IMPORTANT ENTERPRISE.

At the head of Truax island, four miles up stream from Gold Hill, it is possible to take out a ditch which will furnish water for hydraulic plants as for down as Rock Point. This will open up several miles of auriferous gravel which in places has already yielded fabulous sums of gold. A gang of Chinamen worked one of the pay streaks in this district for years, leaving it only when forced to do so by regular owners of the land. An old channel of the river renders the building of this ditch comparatively inexpensive. This proposition will be of inestimable value to the south side of Rogue river.—Oregonian of June 9.

ENGINEER HOWARD'S REPORT.

The Preliminary Survey of the Gold Hill High Line Ditch—Estimate Cost \$700,000.

J. S. Howard, engineer of the preliminary survey of the Gold Hill High Line Ditch, to Phoebe M. DeKum, president of the Ditch Company, contains the following statements:

The whole length of the ditch from Gold Hill to the point of diversion at Prospect is 93 miles. The grade of the ditch, is five and twenty-eight hundredths feet to the mile. The ditch line is measured in all its sinuities, and cross sections taken at each 100 foot station and character of ground noticed as much as possible, and estimates made on this basis.

The cost will be in the neighborhood of \$700,000.

The ditch will cover about 40,000 acres of tillable land.

The construction of the ditch presents no formidable features, there is no ground of sliding nature on the entire line of the ditch. The waste in the driest time of the year will not exceed 20 per cent, which can be obviated by the use of small branches for feeders.
