SERIOUS ACCIDENT.—Last Monday evening John Barker, a wiper in the round house at Grants Pass in some manner slipped and fell under a moving locomotive, which caused the amputation of one of his limbs. He was taken to the hospital at Portland, where it was found necessary to amputate one of his arms also.

CORONERS INQUEST.—Monday forenoon Coroner Hines, of Jacksonville, arrived in the city, and immediately impaneled a jury consisting of A. J. Olsen, E. Earhart, Chas. Smith, J. H. Beeman, T. J. Downing and A. R. Merritt to hold the inquest over the remains of D. W. Cryder, who was killed on the S. P. railroad, near the tool house by the north bound California Express Sunday evening. P. H. Daily and wife were the only witnesses put on the stand and after the evidence had been taken from these witnesses, the jury adjourned until late in the evening, when they gave their verdict, which was to the effect, that the deceased came to his death by being struck with the cars on the S. P. railroad, and that the jury, according to the evidence was unable to place any blame on the Company.

Five tons of dynamite were exploded on the summit of Big Bull mountain, a mile from Victoria, Colo., and 12,000 feet above the sea, on the Fourth, with the idea of furnishing a good imitation of a miniature earthquake, but the resulting disturbance was very like the real thing. No one was hurt, but the town was pretty well shaken up and the shock was felt as far away as 80 miles.
