Americans have in their own country the richest gold fields on the face of the earth, except those in South Africa, and there is a very strong probability that the latter region will not produce as much gold as the United States has done in the past quarter of a century alone. Nothing except restlessness and love of adventure need tempt American gold and silver miners ever to go outside of their own country. They have, between the Rocky mountains and the Pacific, the richest mineral deposits ever found anywhere in the world, and, with the appliances now in use in the United States to extract the metal from refractory ores, their chances for making fortunes are much greater than they are elsewhere. Moreover, while they are at work here, they will be under the guardianship of an enlightened government, which, unlike Canada, imposes no burdensome and vexatious exactions and restrictions.

It looks to the writer like doing the boys of the Second Oregon from Ashland and other Southern Oregon points an injustice to ask them to go to Portland in a body after being mustered out in San Francisco. Who would be foolish enough to expect them to bear their own expenses, just to go to Portland and make a show of themselves? It is absurd to think of such a thing. It will cost them in the neighborhood of \$20 each, to say nothing of the time they would lose in looking for a job. The harvest of grain and fruit is on now in this section of the state and many of the boys will no doubt take employment of this kind for a while at least, or until they can get into something better. If the people of Portland want to see the returned Oregon boys from this section of the state why not put up for it? We don't like the idea of paying the fiddler and dance to the music for the benefit of some one else.

The smelter employees' strike in Colorado has lessened the world's wealth at the rate of \$500,000 a week since June 15, when the eight-hour day law went into effect. At Cripple Creek alone the June gold output decreased \$500,000 below the May record, due to two weeks' shutdown of producing mines. The miners were not involved in the strike, but the shutting down of the smelters limited the output. Throughout Colorado the output shrinkage amounted to \$1,000,000. On the supposition that the strike will end August 1, as is probable, the loss in output will be \$3,000,000. Perhaps \$750,000 will cover the wage loss for the six weeks.

When the eight-hour law went into effect the relations of smelter owners and employees were mutually satisfactory. The law was a piece of vicious class legislation, tarnishing the good name of the state, crippling the principal industry, and embarrassing thousands of laborers. Its unconstitutionality

was doubtless apparent to Governor Thomas and other experienced lawyers, who perpetrated its enactment as a bid for the labor vote.—St. Louis Globe-Democrat.

Young girls would do well to take a lesson from the murder of Clara Fitch. The young lady's parents strenuously objected to her keeping company with the young man with whom she was with the night she was murdered. While it might be possible that he did not commit the crime, circumstantial evidence strongly points to him. The lesson to young girls is, "Obey your parents." If your parents object to your keeping company with certain young men you will do well to heed their wishes, anyway until you are old enough for maturer judgment. Parents may sometimes be wrong, but not so often as children who are tender of years. And another lesson that is valuable along this same line is this, young men with whom parents may safely trust their young daughters at a late hour of the night on the street or elsewhere, away from home, are, sad to say, far too few. There is no estimating the worth of a young man, who has the manhood to be the protector of a young lady's life and virtue when the same may be at his disposal. While parents are careful of their daughters, and they should be, it is just as important that they be careful regarding the training and watchfulness of their sons, that others' daughters may fear no danger when it is their company.—Ex.

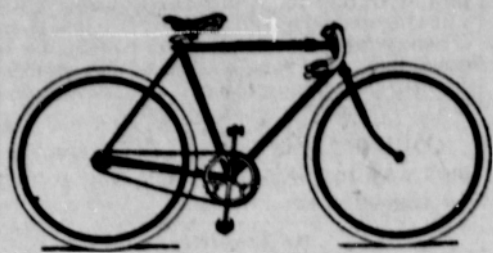

There is an old printer in the government printing office in Washington who worked on the Hartford Courant when the late Robert Bonner was setting type in that office. A "tramp" came along, and, getting a day, offered to bet \$10 he could set more type than any other man in the office. Mr. Bonner told the "tramp" that he was not a

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gambler, but that he would chance him \$10 just for fun. The money was put up and the two men got down to their cases. In 20 hours and 28 minutes Mr. Bonner had set and corrected 25,500 ems of solid minion, besides taking time to eat three pieces of custard pie and drink two glasses of milk. Mr. Bonner was recognized as one of the fastest printers in the country. He was the first man to enter a typesetting contest in America, and it is a coincidence that Leo Monheimer, the last to win one, died within one week of Mr. Bonner. The greatest record ever made was setting and correcting 33,000 ems in 24 hours, an average of about 1376 ems an hour.

GATHERING CHITTIM BARK.

A Small Industry That Puts Money Into Circulation.

TOLEDO, Or., July 31.—The gathering of chittim bark (cascara sagrada) is to this section about what hop-picking is to the Willamette valley, in that it affords families an opportunity to take a summer outing and at the same time be remuneratively employed. Beginning a short distance from Toledo, and extending as far east as Lebanon, chittim trees are found in the canyons. The operation of peeling is simple, and an expert readily makes his \$3 per day. The trees frequently attain a diameter of 18 inches. Once started at the base of the trunk, the bark peels as readily as slippery elm, by simply pulling the loosened end. In about three days after being peeled the bark becomes seasoned, when it is broken into small pieces and sacked. It is only within the past three years that this industry has developed here. It puts thousands of dollars into circulation every summer. The ruling price for chittim bark is \$55 per ton, delivered at the railroad. As high as \$65 has been paid. This bark is shipped in solid carloads to San Francisco and the East, where it enters into the composition of a large number of patent medicines.
