The mining men of this section should assist the Board of Trade here in gathering an exhibit of all kinds of mineral deposits. It should be to their interest to do so, and the public is interested in such an exhibit.

They say a demand will bring a supply. Gold Hill is in need of more dwelling houses. Every house in town is full, and two and three families in one. It is to be hoped the supply of more houses will not be long in coming.

Gold Hill is attracting attention and the leaven is just beginning to work. Wait a few months and then ask about Gold Hill. Our increase of voting population in one year is pretty fair, but it will be one hundred per cent by next April.

We are informed that John W. Cox and Geo. F. Lyman, were once partners in a rich strike on Sam's creek near Gold Hill, several years ago. As the story goes, Mr. Cox went to the Frazer river mines and "went broke." When he came back here he went down to Rock Point and asked Ben Hammond for a two weeks credit for provisions, telling Mr. Hammond that he was "broke" but would pay him as soon as he "struck" something. Mr. Hammond fitted him out with a months supply, and he and Geo. Lyman went to work on some placer ground near the county road leading into Sams Valley. In about two weeks they took out seventeen hundred dollars. This illustrates the fortunes of mining.

F. H. Kelly informs us that he himself saw three prospectors come in last Wednesday from the head of Sam's creek, six miles from Gold Hill, with three pans of dirt. The first one went \$40, the second \$5 and the third \$100. This would be easily believed if it had occurred at Cape Nome, but here in Southern Oregon people will think it is a fable.

Capt. Wm Hembree, of Medford, was in town Tuesday, and he and Capt. W. A. Carter were exchanging experiences of camp life at Medford just before the Spanish war. Mr. Hembree has been making a business trip out among the mines, and is looking for a place to locate a stamp mill. He visited the Gold Bug mine, about forty five miles north of here, where the five stamp mill is running on very rich ore, and ten stamps more are to be added. Thirty five men are at work, and the ledge is from 16 to 18 feet wide. It cost Senator Jones \$17,000 to build a road into the mine, but it has amply repaid him. The tunnel is in about four hundred feet.
