Seven states will hold elections prior to the vote for President in November, Oregon taking the lead. North Carolina will follow next in order with her state election, the date being August 2; that of Alabama is August 6, that of Arkansas September 3, of Vermont September 4, Maine September 10, and Georgia October 3. Of these, only Oregon and Maine will furnish Presidential straws.

The wife of a Vancouver man named Theilsieffe allowed her affections to be alienated from him by a man named Langberg, and a jury yesterday awarded the husband \$4000 damages against the alienator. If the jury had been

allowed to consider the name that the woman had to bear, the verdict might have been very much smaller.—Ex.

Whether a member of Congress counts for little or much depends largely upon the influence he has in committee where in these days of innumerable bills, legislation is shaped for action. Length of service has much to do with a member's standing at Washington. In this respect Congressman Tongue, who has served two terms, has a distinct advantage over Dr. Daly, his Democratic opponent, who would, if elected, go to the National capital new to the business of caring for the interests of the First district. There exists no reason why any voter in the First district should vote for Daly in preference to Tongue. This particularly applies to Republicans. To Democrats Tongue has the recommendation of having served the district well for two terms, of knowing its present and future needs and of being better qualified to serve the people than a new man would be.

There are many commendable things to be said for C. B. Watson, district attorney, who is now candidate for re-election. He is the most economical man to the taxpayers who ever held that office in this district. He does not bring a case for the mere sake of having it in the courts, but uses his judgment in the matter and presents only those cases in which the evidence justifies a reasonable possibility of conviction. He conducts his prosecutions with ability, which his long term of legal experience, much of it in criminal cases, has made second to that of no lawyer in the district. One feature of his practice deserves especial mention, and that is his courteous treatment of witnesses on the stand. He never adopts bulldozing or insulting tactics in examinations as is the exasperating and reprehensible habit of too many attorneys, and never forgets to be a gentleman in or out of court. If this quality were made more of a consideration for legal preferment, a cleaner atmosphere would pervade our courtrooms.

INCONSISTENT DR. DALY.

Senator Daly of Lake, now the fusion nominee for Congress, introduced in the last Legislature Senate Bill No. 22, amending Section 2813 of the general laws of Oregon, to read as follows:

Section 2813. On or before the first day of May in each year the several county treasurers of the state shall pay over to the State Treasurer, in GOLD AND SILVER COIN, the amount of state taxes charged to their respective counties.
