The present is not the first occasion when the American Navy has come into armed collision with China. In November, 1856, our naval forces assaulted and captured three Chinese forts in resentment for unprovoked attack of Chinese upon the American vessels of war.

In the assault a gallant young American naval officer was killed and several of his men killed and wounded.

The Ninth United States Infantry that started June 27, from Manila for China, was organized by act of Congress, March 3, 1855. It fought the battle of White River, Washington Territory, on March 1, 1856, and that of Spokane, on May 17, 1858. During the Civil War the Ninth Infantry served at the battles of Stone River, Chickamauga, Missionary Ridge, Resaca, Kenesaw Mountain, Peach Tree Creek and Atlanta. It served in the Indian campaigns in Dakota in 1866-1867, and took part in the Sioux War of 1876-1877. In the Santiago campaign of 1898 it took part in the surrender of Santiago the Ninth was chosen by General Shafter as the regiment to enter and occupy the city. It was sent to the Philippines in March, 1899, by way of San Francisco and served at Calocan and at San Pedro Macati, and was in Lawton's expedition to Arayat last Autumn. It is the first American regiment to see service in China.—Oregonian.

Of the registered vote of the state which is a little over 100,000, the municipal indebtedness received about 16 per cent; the judiciary amendment about 15 per cent; the irrigation amendment about 16 per cent; the repealing amendment 19 per cent, and the woman suffrage amendment 26.4 per cent. Taking the vote actually cast as 80,000, the woman suffrage amendment received about 33 per cent; the repealing amendment a little less than 24 per cent; the irrigation amendment 20 per cent; the judiciary amendment nearly 19 per cent, and the municipal indebtedness amendment a little over 20 per cent. The people of Oregon do not want to amend the Constitution of the state, at least on these lines.

Train Brakeman Killed.

His funeral was held Monday from the home of his parents, under the auspices of Philanthropic lodge, I. O. O. F., of which he was a member.
