A surplus of over \$81,000,000 for the last fiscal year is a pretty good showing for republican party government considering that heavy war expenses, as well as the ordinary expenditures of government were paid out of the receipts.

When we add that the national debt has been decreased to some \$40,000,000 in the same time, the showing becomes phenomenal.

The Oregon City advertising committee of the Board of Trade will submit a report at the meeting of that body to be held next Monday night. The members of the committee have agreed upon printing a 40-page booklet, 6x9, that will set forth the natural resources and superior advantages of Clackamas County. The booklet will be profusely illustrated, and will contain cuts of factories, mills, farms, business houses, etc. Ten thousand of these pamphlets will be printed for general distribution.

This is an excellent idea, and one that could be used to good advantage in every town and county in the state, Gold Hill excepted.

The hand of destiny is in the events that have drawn America from her position of isolation and placed her in the forefront in time to inject American ideas into the treatment of the Eastern question.
