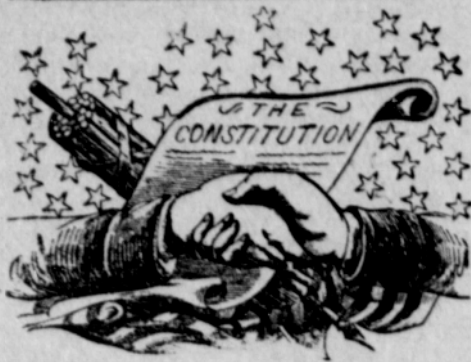

Texas wool growers are trying to do a little trust business by holding 2,000,000 pounds of wool to force a rise in price.

The director of the mint has been advised, by the United States minister to Peru, that the latter country has adopted the single gold standard.

Taking the census returns already completed as a guide, the indications are that the total population of the United States is between 75,000,000 and 78,000,000.

It remains for the populists and the democrats to fight it out as to whether Bryan is a democrat or populist. There is such a small difference that it looks like hair-splitting to even refer to it.

The leaders of the republicans in this county should begin to do a little business at the "old stand"—It is now about time to organize a company of "Rough Riders," and get into the harness ready to work—Don't be to confident gentlemen!

The Tammany Ice Trust is coming fever and thirst into such handsome profit that their Mayor is receiving an annual dividend of \$35,000 on his stock. This is no political canard, for the Democratic Mayor confessed it under oath on the witness stand.

The children of school age in Oregon this year number 133,181. In 1890 they numbered 99,543. The increase is 33,638. Taking this increase as an indication of present population, we should expect the census of the United States, soon to be published, to show a population in Oregon of 428,000—a gain of 115,000 in ten years.

On June 1, 1896, the total circulation of money in the United States was \$1,521,584,283, a little less than \$500,000,000 being in the form of gold and gold certificates. On July 1, 1900, the volume of money in the country was \$2,341,899,180, of which \$2,062,425,495 was in circulation. In four years the enormous sum of half a billion dollars gold has been added to the people's money. This is in excess of all the silver mined in the United States—at a ratio of 16 to 1—since 1896.
