GOLD HILL MINES

TO THE FRONT.

CREDIT TO WHOM CREDIT IS DUE.

The Following was Taken From the Telegram of October 15th.

"Messrs. H. B. Nye and H. G. Wortman, of Gold Hill, Jackson county, Oregon, visited the Portland Mining Stock Exchange this a. m. and exhibited a silver medal issued by the seventh annual Spokane Industrial Exposition for the best exhibit of gold ores. On one side of the medal is the inscription 'Washington, Idaho, Oregon, Montana and British Columbia,' who were in competition for the awards, and on the reverse side 'Seventh Annual Spokane Industrial Exposition 1900.' Messrs. Nye and Wortman exhibited an assay button weighing 44-100 of an ounce, value \$3.98, from an assay taken of their ore from their famous mine on Galls creek. This assay shows a value of 3247.05 ounces per ton, or \$67,116.52 per ton for the crude ore. The location of this mine is on Galls creek, Jackson county, Oregon."

When it is taken in consideration that Messrs. Nye and Wortman are mining quantities of this grade of ore, and that this vein is not a "pocket proposition," but a well defined contact vein, traceable for a long distance on the surface, with well defined ore chutes continuous to an unknown depth, the magnitude of this property can readily be seen by practical mining men.

Other and adjoining county papers are cautioned not to remove this mine to their immediate vicinity. It is at present located but FOUR MILES FROM GOLD HILL, the nearest R. R. station and supply point. And we trust will be allowed to remain a valuable addition to the Gold Hill mines.

Messrs. Nye and Wortman are to be thanked for their valuable efforts in collecting a lot of Jackson county ores which have carried off the first honors in competition with such mining states as Montana, Idaho, Washington, British Columbia and far famed Eastern Oregon. "It is up" to those sections now to beat us for valuable ores if they can.

Peculiar Problem.

The following peculiar problem was clipped from an exchange:
