DIE AT THE THROTTLE.

Many Locomotive Engineers Expire at Their Posts.

Within the last few years there have been so many engineers who have dropped dead while running their engines that the suddenness of the death of so many men employed in the same capacity has caused considerable comment. There is scarcely a road in the country on which one or more engineers have not thus suddenly departed life while on duty in the locomotive cab. There have also been a number of instances in which engineers have met with death by accident while seated in the locomotives.

It is not, however, the accidents to engineers, but their deaths from heart failure, paralysis, etc., which are of the greatest significance. Many railroad people will well remember a sudden death which occurred on an engine of one of the great western roads not very long ago. A fast train was thundering along over the rails at its usual rate of speed. Suddenly the fireman noticed that the train shot over the grade crossings of a country road without the usual preceding whistle. The fireman looked over at the engineer and wondered what in the world was the matter. The engineer was sitting on the little seat on his side of the engine, with his eyes on the track ahead. The fireman concluded that by just a little oversight or forgetfulness the engineer had neglected to pull the whistle. About the next minute the train flew over another crossing without the whistle blowing. The fireman grew a little uneasy, but he was disinclined to call the attention of the engineer to his mistake for fear his correction might not be kindly received. But a few minutes later the train ran by a station where it was scheduled to stop. Then the fireman's eyes began to stand out—a queer lump came up in his throat, and for a few minutes he remained frozen to his seat and staring at the engineer, who still kept his seat and looked steadily ahead at the glittering rails. Another station seemed to fairly fly past the train and the fireman began to regain his senses. He slowly got down from his seat and stepped over to the engineer.

"Say," old man," he said half hesitatingly, as if fearing he would get called down for interrupting his superior's thoughts. There was no reply.

here the fireman reached forward and touched the engineer's arm. He sprang back with a startled look on his face; then he jumped forward and with both hands shook the engineer. Then the fireman knew why the train had sped over the crossings without whistling and why it had run past stations where it stopped every day. The engineer was dead. The fireman sprang to the throttle and brought the train to a stop as it was entering the next town. A physician was hurriedly summoned, but he was too late to be of any service. He said the man had been dead for nearly an hour. "Heart failure" was his verdict. The fireman ran the train until it arrived at one of the larger towns, where another engineer was taken on to finish the trip.

This was a typical case of the engineer expiring at his post. All of the many cases of death are of almost exactly this same character. The engineer fails to whistle, runs past stations or falls to slow up when going down grade or passing through stations where the law requires slower speed, and then for the first time the fireman discovers something is wrong and steps over to his chief to find that without the least warning life has departed.

"I have been thinking much lately about these sudden deaths of engineers," said an old railroad man the other day, "and I have just about come to the conclusion that it is caused by pure nervous strain and nothing else. Few people realize what great strain an engineer, a conscientious one, is under. He has hundreds of lives in his hands all of the time and the responsibility of these, together with the fear that he may sometime run over some innocent victim, is enough, when long continued, to try the nerves of the strongest."

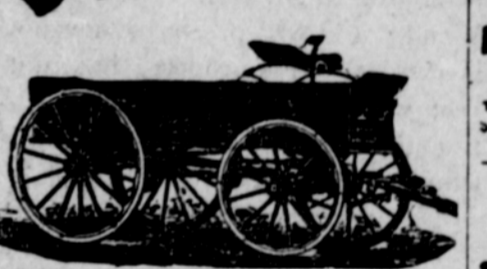
