Li Hung Chang, Sheng and oth-
er Chinese capitalists have estab-
lished a cotton factory with a cap-
ital of 2,000,000 taels. The build-

ings are said to cover 60 acres, its
employees to number 6000, and its
products to be 1000 pieces of cloth
and 80,000 pounds of cotton yarn
every 24 hours. The factory is run
day and night, each shift of work-
men working 11½ hours. The mill
has 50 looms and 90,000 spindles,
and is as up to date as any Massa-
chusetts factory. The cotton used
in this mill is grown in China. At
present, there are in operation in
China 378,000 spindles, with the
prospect that many more will be
set running in the immediate fu-
ture. The factory girls earn the
equivalent in our money of 14 cts.
per day.
