The population of Oregon as of ficially announced Tuesday by the census office at Washington is 418,-536, as against 313,767 for 1890. This is an increase of 99,769, or 31.7 per cent. Of the counties in the state Jackson ranks twelfth with a population of 13,698, an increase over the figures of 1890 of 19½ per cent.—a most substantial growth. 
