The war with the Boers has cost England upwards of \$600,000,000, and it is not yet ended. In view of this fact we ought not to feel that we are not getting our money's worth in the Philippine Islands.

The state of Washington has passed Oregon in the race for population. She increased 48 per cent. in the last decade, while we increased nearly 38 per cent. Washington has 518,103 against Oregon's 413,506.

Seventy-five per cent of the circulation at Nome and other Alaskan points is in Canadian currency; in the Klondike American bills are at a premium. J. N. Garner, special agent of the Treasury Department, says: "In Nome I found 75 per cent of the money in circulation was Canadian money. About 15 per cent was American and 10 per cent gold dust."

A large Dublin manufacturer has a room entirely furnished with Irish peat. The carpets on the floor, the curtains at the windows and paper on the wall are all made from this substance. For years he has experimented with the material, which is now very largely exported as fuel and as he has discovered that from it it is possible to procure almost any kind of fabric.

The question of organizing some more new counties in Oregon is again bobbing up for the next legislature to settle. The Antelope region is said to be the center of one such movement and the Hood River section of another. And then Malheur county's seat of government promises to become a bone of contention once more between the forces of Ontario and those of Vale, the present county seat.

Secretary Long asks for only two first-class battle ships, two first-class armored cruisers, six light draught gunboats, some smaller craft for river service, a repair ship, transport, training ships and colliers. The Secretary's moderation is due to the fact that the department now has fifty-three vessels under construction, and these call for large expenditures, the total naval estimates for the ensuing year being fixed at \$87,000,000, which beats the record in our navy for one year in time of peace.

It will be but two months until the regular biennial encounter between the conglomerated miscar-

riage of political honesty and the "Salem Hog" will take place at the Capitol building in Salem. The "bull-fight" that will occur at that meeting over the United States senatorship will, perhaps, make the Spanish bullpen a place of recreation and comfort as compared with it. The only comfort to be found in this whole affair is that it has fully come to be considered a necessary evil.—North Yamhill Record.

The details of such a death are shocking enough when read at a distance from the scene of the tragedy. When witnessed and followed up for a mile or more, as in this case, by a brother of the mangled victim, they are horrible past belief. The hope, even though a faint one, that the story will prove a warning to boys who attempt in this hazardous way to get something for nothing, justifies the spreading of the shocking details of the occurrence before the public.—Oregonian
