Young man did you ever figure what it costs you to smoke one five cent cigar a day for twenty-five years? As at this season many persons are sending packages by parcel post, the following extracts from the law regarding the mailing of such packages will be of interest to them:

"No parcel may contain packages addressed to persons other than the person named on the outside address of the parcel itself. If such packages be detected they must be sent forward singly, and charged with new and distinct parcel postage rates.

"A parcel must not be posted in a letterbox, but must be taken into the postoffice and presented to the postmaster or person in charge, between the hours of 9 a.m. and 5 p.m.

"See that the parcel is securely and substantially packed, so that it can be safely transmitted in the ordinary mail sacks, and that it is so wrapped or inclosed that it can be opened without damaging the cover, so that its contents can be easily examined by the postmaster.

"The postage must in all cases be prepaid by means of postage stamps. A letter of communication in the nature of personal correspondence must not accompany be written, or inclosed in any parcel. If such be found the letter will be placed in the mails if separable, and if the communication be inseparably attached, the whole parcel will be rejected."
