

George Dunn's Statement to Voters

In consenting to run for the nomination for the office of county judge, I feel that it is due the electorate of Jackson county, Oregon, to set forth fully the reasons which have prompted me to do so.

There is not, nor can there be, any strong personal desire for the office, for everyone knows that the duties appertaining to that office are many, complex and difficult, under ordinary conditions, and will be doubly onerous under the conditions that now prevail in the county and in respect to the county's finances.

I was born in Jackson county, and feel, and can, therefore, be pardoned for feeling, a pride in the prosperity and the upbuilding of this beautiful valley. I want to live long enough to this valley the garden spot of the state, and I desire that she shall progress along safe and sane lines, employing her many and diverse resources as rapidly as the most favorable conditions will permit.

I believe that the affairs of Jackson county should be administered in a businesslike manner, always keeping within the law. If any law is wrong, let us change the law, but, so long as it is a law, let us abide by it. If we have outgrown the constitution of our state, let us amend it, not violate it.

I believe in the construction of permanent roads, adapted to our present needs, and, so far as can be determined, to our future needs, and, should I be elected county judge, I shall use all lawful means at my command to further the construction of substantial permanent roads for this county.

We have a county indebtedness approximating \$525,000, a large percentage of which is not an indebtedness contemplated by the law. But no person who has regard for the welfare of the county would seek to repudiate any of that indebtedness. However, I think that some steps should be taken towards legalizing the same, if it is possible to do so.

If the people of this county desire the issuance of bonds for the construction of permanent roads, as may be shown by a vote of the people, of the county, should I be elected county judge, I shall endeavor to make every dollar of the bonds thus voted do its full duty, and without favor to any locality, but, as far as possible, apply the sums voted, for the best interests of the entire county.

I shall not favor the employment of convicts or undesirable foreigners upon the public improvements of the county, so long as it is possible to get our own citizens, or those who have, in good faith, declared their intention to become such, to perform the roads or other improvements that may be established.

I feel that our first duty is to our own citizens, and that, if there is a public fund available for expenditure upon the public roads these citizens should have the first right to earn by their labor, the money thus expended.

The horticultural interests of Jackson county have grown to such proportions that it is imperative that the same should have competent, efficient and scientific supervision, and, if I shall be elected to the office of county judge, it will be my purpose that the laws in these particulars shall be strictly enforced.

In short, if I shall be elected to the office of county judge, I shall endeavor honestly and energetically and to the extent of my intelligence, to obey and enforce the laws as I understand them.

I have no other pledges or promises to make to the people of Jackson county, and I have made no other pledge or promise to any one. And, while I shall always court advice and counsel, if elected, I shall be as free as "the dew from heaven" to perform every duty devolving upon me, as the dictates of my conscience and whatever ability I may have, shall suggest.
