For The Destruction of Flies.

These rules were published by the Merchants' Exchange of New York, and will answer for all localities:

Keep the flies away from the sick, especially those suffering from contagious diseases. Kill every fly that enters the sick room. Do not allow decaying material of any sort to accumulate on or near your premises. All refuse which tends in any way to fermentation, such as bedding straw, paper waste and vegetable matter, should be burned, or covered with lime. All foods should be screened. All receptacles for garbage should be kept carefully covered and the cans cleaned or sprinkled with lime, oil, or other cheap preparation. See that your sewer is in good order, that it does not leak, is up-to-date and is not exposed to flies. Pour coal oil in the drains. Cover all food; burn, bury or feed all table refuse. Screen all foods for sale; screen all windows and doors, and especially those of kitchen and dining room. Burn pyrethrum powder in the house; don't forget that flies have their breeding place in filth; it may be on your premises; even inside your room. Keep your own premises clean, and if there is an unabated nuisance in the neighborhood, advise the health department of it at once.

It is well known that one female house fly lays about one hundred and twenty eggs during the season, and she selects a place where there is an accumulation of filth—any decaying animal and vegetable matter that will furnish food for her larvae; the eggs mature in about ten days, and in a season there may be ten or twelve generations. Thus, under favorable conditions, millions of flies may result from the eggs of a single house fly.
