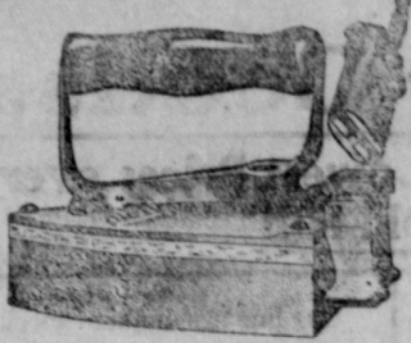

## Proposed Amendments to the City Charter of Gold Hill

(Continued from first page)

subject to the direction of the mayor and city council and in case of conflict the will of the council shall control. He shall collect all taxes, fines, liens, assessments, and licenses levied or imposed by the city council or the recorder, and pay the same over to the recorder, taking his receipts therefor. The recorder shall pay all moneys received by him to the treasurer and take his receipts for the same, and place them on file in his office.

Sec. 11. That Section 27 of the Charter of the city of Gold Hill be amended so as to read as follows:

Section 27. The city council, immediately after taking the oath of office, shall organize by electing one of its members chairman of the council, which member shall perform the duties of the mayor in the absence or inability of the mayor to act. The council shall keep a record of all their proceedings, and shall meet at least once each month, and oftener if called together by the mayor or by written notice of three members of said council. Provided further that public notice of all special meetings of the council shall be given by the city bell call.

Sec. 12. That Section 28 of the Charter of the city of Gold Hill be amended so as to read as follows:

Section 28. The city council shall have power within the city to create an indebtedness to the amount of fifteen hundred (\$1500.00) dollars but no indebtedness in excess of this amount shall be incurred by the council except by first calling an election of the legal voters of the city to vote thereon, which call shall state the amount to be borrowed, the terms upon which and the time for which, the said money is to be had, and the object and purpose for which the same is to be used. At such elections, all those in favor of borrowing said moneys shall vote "yes", and those opposed thereto, "no", and the vote of the majority shall control; provided, that all indebtedness over and above fifteen hundred dollars (\$1500.00) shall be a bonded indebtedness, bearing a stated time, but no indebtedness, except for water purposes, shall be incurred by said city in excess of the sum of eight per cent (8%) of the assessed valuation.

For the purpose of purchasing or constructing a system of water works to supply said city and its inhabitants with water, the city council are hereby authorized to incur additional indebtedness and to issue bonds of the city therefor in a sum not exceeding twenty five thousand dollars (\$25000.00), bearing interest at a rate not exceeding six per cent (6%) per annum, to be sold at not less than par value and accrued interest, and such water bonds may be issued by the city council when deemed necessary for that purpose, by submitting the proposition to the electors, and such bonds shall not be computed in ascertaining the limitation to eight per cent (8%) above stated.

Sec. 13. That Section 29 of the Charter of the city of Gold Hill be amended so as to read as follows:

Section 29. The city council shall have power to license, tax, regulate, restrain and prohibit theatrical and all other exhibitions, shows and amusements, merry-go-rounds, bowling alleys, dance houses and skating rinks. They shall have the sole and exclusive right and power to license, tax, regulate, control and prohibit bar-rooms, drinking shops, and all places where spirituous or malt liquors are sold or kept for sale. Irrespective of any general law of the state on this subject enacted by the legislative assembly or the people at large: Provided, that no license for the sale of spirituous, vinous or malt liquors shall be granted for less sum than is, or may be provided by the general laws of the state in force at the time of the granting thereof, and provided further that no such license shall be granted until the applicant therefor furnishes a bond to the city in such amount and with such surety as the council shall order, said bond to be for not less than six (6) months and conditioned that no such license will permit minors or females to frequent or loiter in or about his place of business, and that he will not sell nor give any intoxicating liquor to any minor, female or habitual drunkard. No part of any such license or tax shall be turned over to the county or state.

Sec. 14. That section 30 of the charter of the city of Gold Hill be amended so as to read as follows:

Section 30. The council shall have the power to license, tax and regulate all mercantile and business houses, and all other branches of business, which in the judgment of the council, should be licensed or taxed, whether the same be conducted within doors, in tents or in the open air.

To license, tax and regulate auctioneers, peddlers, street vendors, brokers, pawnbrokers and dealers in second hand goods;

To provide against disorderly conduct, disturbance of the peace and all nuisances of every kind; To prohibit bawdy houses; To define and prohibit gaming or gambling, to suppress houses or places where gambling is carried on or permitted, and to punish persons keeping such houses or places and persons for gambling;

To define vagrancy and to provide for the punishment, support, and employment of vagrants and paupers.

To regulate the use of sidewalks

and to prohibit the riding of bicycles, motor cycles and horses thereon;

To license, tax and regulate the running at large of domestic animals of all kinds and to compel the payment of an annual license tax upon each dog within said city by the owner thereof; to provide for the taking up and impounding of all domestic animals running at large in violation of the ordinances or said city, and of all animals upon which any license tax provided for by ordinance shall be unpaid and to provide for the sale of any such animals to defray the cost of taking the same up and of keeping the same while so impounded and to provide for the killing of all dogs on which any license tax shall not be paid as required by ordinance. But all license, taxes and fines collected on account of the running at large of domestic animals or the impounding of the same and all licenses collected from owners of dogs shall be turned over to the street and alley fund.

Sec. 15: That section 31 of the charter of the city of Gold Hill be amended so as to read as follows:

Section 31. The city council shall have the power to make, cause or order to be made such alterations, improvement and repairs to the streets, sidewalks, alleys and highways and bridges as they may deem for the best interests of the city; to provide for or order the construction, maintenance and repair of streets, roadways, culverts, gutters, drains, ditches, sidewalks, bridges, and alleys, and to compel the inhabitants of said city to make proper connections therewith, and use thereof, and to assess the cost of all such work against the property benefited thereby; to fix fire limits and to prescribe the manner of building and materials of all buildings therein; to compel owners of occupied, unoccupied, improved and unimproved property within or without said fire limits to remove therefrom all inflammable material, or to supply connection with the city water supply in such manner as, in the judgment of the council, will minimize the danger from fire to said property and the adjoining properties. All city trunk sewers, lateral sewers and water supply system shall be constructed and maintained by and at the expense of the city.

The council shall give notice in such manner as may be provided by ordinance, of its intention to cause any improvement to be made, the cost of which it proposes to assess against the property benefited thereby and shall by such notice fix a time and place at which the council will meet to hear protests thereto and shall define the property which it proposes to assess for such improvement. If at said meeting the owners of more than sixty (60 per cent) per cent of the property so to be assessed shall protest against said improvement and the assessing of the cost thereof against said property, no part of the cost of making said improvement shall be assessed against said property but the council may, in its discretion, make said improvement and pay therefor out of the general fund of the city.

Sec. 16: That section 32 of the charter of the city of Gold Hill be amended so as to read as follows:

Section 32: To regulate and control the storage of gunpowder and other explosive and combustible materials, the use of oil or gas for lighting or heating purposes, and to regulate, control or abate the use of flues and chimneys or other apparatus which may be dangerous in causing fires; to regulate, control, or condemn entrances, exits and stairways of theaters and all other buildings; and to regulate the manner of building partitions and party walls, and to regulate or prohibit the sale or use of fire-crackers, bombs, rockets, etc.

Sec. 17. That section 34 of the charter of the city of Gold Hill be amended so as to read as follows:

Section 34: The city council shall have power to prescribe the manner of the collection of all assessments against any property in said city, and all assessments herein provided for shall be a lien upon the property affected thereby, and, in the absence of any provision for the collection or enforcement of such lien by the council, the same shall be certified by the recorder, together with the annual city tax levy, to the county clerk of Jackson County, to be collected and accounted for by the tax collector as other taxes are collected and shall be by him paid over to the county treasurer, to the credit of the city.

Sec. 18: That section 36 of the charter of the city of Gold Hill be amended so as to read as follows:

Section 36: The city may annually levy on all the property in said city, taxable for county and state taxes, a city tax, not to exceed five (5) mills on the dollar, for city purposes, and also such further amount as the council may deem necessary for the payment of interest and principal of any debt now or hereafter existing against the city.

Council may also levy such tax as they may deem advisable to create a sinking fund to apply upon any debts when needed. Any license exacted or collected upon any place, person, pursuit or calling and the property connected therewith shall not be considered in conflict with the provisions of this section.

Sec. 19: That section 37 of the charter of the city of Gold Hill be amended so as to read as follows:

Section 37: The city council shall have the power to acquire, by purchase or otherwise, or to lease or construct, and to maintain an electric lighting and power system or other lighting system, and to contract for electric current for the purpose of lighting said city, and to maintain and control transmission lines for the distribution of said electric current, and to operate the same, provided that no private person or corporation shall be granted any right or franchise to maintain or operate any lighting system, or to sell or distribute electric current in said city in competition with the system owned or operated by said city. The city council, however, shall not have power to sell, lease or convey its water or light system, except after first submitting the proposals to a vote of the people. The city council shall have power to regulate the sale and distribution of water, light and power.

The city council shall have the right to regulate, control or prohibit the erection of electric light, telegraph, telephone, or other poles or wires upon or over the streets or alleys or public parks of said city and the laying of water or other pipes and sewers.

Sec. 20: That section 39 of the charter of the city of Gold Hill be amended so as to read as follows:

Section 39. The enacting clause of every ordinance or resolution shall be: "The people of the city of Gold Hill do ordain or resolve as follows:": And every ordinance and resolution, to be valid, must receive the affirmative vote of a majority of the council, and every ordinance and resolution of the said city shall be published once in a newspaper published and of general circulation in said city, provided there be such a newspaper.

Sec. 21: That section 43 of the charter of the city of Gold Hill be amended so as to read as follows:

Section 43: No officer of the city, elective or appointive, shall during his term of office, be interested in any contract, the expenses of which are to be paid out of the city treasury; nor shall the treasurer be allowed to pay any money out of the treasury, except on warrant properly allowed and signed. He shall keep a true record of all moneys received and paid out by him, and of watch receipts and disbursements on account of the various funds, and shall present the same to the council on the first Monday in March and September of each year. The recorder shall make out and submit similar reports of the moneys received by him and warrants drawn and balance on hand, at the same time, and the said recorder's report and treasurer's report must correspond throughout. Before any contract shall be made by said city for the doing of any work or the furnishing of any supplies in excess of one hundred (\$100.00) dollars a public notice thereof calling for sealed bids or proposals shall be published in a newspaper published and of general circulation in said city at least fourteen (14) days before the awarding of said contract, and if the obligation to be incurred by said contract shall exceed the sum of one thousand (\$1000.00) dollars such notice shall be given for a period of thirty (30) days before the awarding of said contract and no contract for the doing of work or the furnishing of supplies to said city shall be awarded except to the lowest responsible bidder.

Section 22: That section 44 of the charter of the city of Gold Hill be amended so as to read as follows:

Section 44: The mayor shall act as the executive officer of said city. He shall preside at all meetings of the council but shall have no vote except in the case of a tie when he shall cast the deciding vote, provided all members are present. The mayor, shall in the event of the absence, resignation or inability to act of the recorder, preside as a recorder's court in the trial of any person who is entitled to a trial before the recorder. He shall have power to appoint a recorder, in case of a vacancy to act until the next regular meeting of the council, who shall then elect such officer, to hold until the next regular election. No one shall be authorized to sign warrants, contracts or minutes except the mayor or chairman of the council. Any member of the council, including the mayor, who shall move out of the city, or shall absent himself for three consecutive regular meetings of the council without the consent of the council shall be deemed to have forfeited his office and the same shall be declared vacant.
