City Ordinance Providing Dog License

An Ordinance regulating the running at large of dogs and bitches and providing for the licensing of such dogs and bitches and for taking up and killing or selling of all unlicensed dogs and bitches found running at large.

The people of the city of Gold Hill do ordain as follows:

Sec. 1. It shall be unlawful for any person to permit any dog or bitch owned or controlled by him to run at large or be on any street or alley of the city of Gold Hill without first obtaining for such dog or bitch a license as hereafter provided.

Sec. 2. Every person desiring a license for any dog or bitch shall pay to the recorder of said city the sum of \$1.50 for each dog and \$3.00 for each bitch to be licensed and the recorder shall thereupon issue to such person a suitable metal license tag, which shall be deemed to be a license for the dog for which it is issued during the year in which it is issued. Said tag shall be numbered and shall have stamped thereon the year of the issuance thereof and the same shall expire on the 15th day of June of the year following such issuance.

Sec. 3. The recorder shall keep a book to be known as dog license book, wherein shall be entered in convenient form the name of the person taking each license, the amount paid therefor, the number of the license tag and a brief description of the dog or bitch licensed.

Sec. 4. It shall be the duty of the owner or person in control of any dog or bitch licensed as aforesaid to securely fasten and keep upon the animal as licensed by means of a collar around the neck of such animal, the license tag so issued.

Sec. 5. It shall be the duty of every city marshal or police officer of the city of Gold Hill to take up and safely keep for a period of three days every dog or bitch found running at large without a license tag after the 1st day of July of any year.

If animal shall be kept in some suitable place to be provided by the city therefor. The owner of any such animal may at any time within said three days claim the same and pay the amount necessary for a license for such animal, together with the sum of fifty cents for the taking up and care of said animal and thereupon said animal shall be delivered to the person so claiming the same. If at the end of three days any animal so taken up has not been claimed it shall be the duty of the city marshal of said city under his direction to kill such animal, provided, however, that after the expiration of said three days, the city marshal may in his discretion sell any such dog or bitch at private sale to the person who will pay the highest price therefor in excess of fifty cents and also pay the necessary fees for obtaining license therefor and the amount so received for the purchase price thereof shall be northward turned over to the city treasurer of said city.

Sec. 6. The Mayor of the city of Gold Hill, with the consent of the city council, may appoint some suitable person to attend to the collection of dog licenses and the enforcement of the terms of this ordinance, and such person when so appointed shall perform all of the duties herein imposed on the city recorder and police officers of said city. They shall hold said position at the pleasure of the Mayor and shall receive such compensation as the council shall determine. The duty of disposing of the carcasses of all animals killed by him in pursuance of this ordinance may also be imposed on him.

Sec. 7. All moneys received by any person in pursuance of the terms of this ordinance for licenses or for care of animals shall forthwith be turned over to the treasurer of said city and his receipt therefor be obtained.

Sec. 8. No female dog in time of heat or habitually vicious dog shall be permitted to run at large within said city, whether licensed or not and it shall be lawful for the city marshal of said city to kill any such female or vicious dog whenever found running at large. Any person violating the provisions of this section of this ordinance shall, upon conviction, be fined not more than twenty-five dollars.

All ordinances and parts of ordinances in conflict with this ordinance is hereby revoked.

The foregoing ordinance was passed by the city council of the city of Gold Hill on the 4th day of June, 1914, by the following vote: five in favor, one absent.
