## YES SIR!

Very often we hear people say that they are not going to pay for a paper and when the facts are known it is found that at some time in the past they ordered the paper from the publisher and then neglected to refuse it at the postoffice and of course the paper still came and they accepted it and read it. The United States Supreme Court has rendered a decision in a number of cases that when a subscriber or person receives a paper from the postoffice he thereby accepts it and is bound to pay for it as long as he takes it from the his box. They also say that where a man subscribes to a paper and lets it run year after year he cannot stop the paper unless he pays for the amount he has received. This can be done by making special deals with the publisher. In recent years however the Law has been changed to limit the publisher from allowing credit to any subscriber for more than one year, unless a special promise to pay or an order is given for its extension. This can be verbal or written. There has been quite a little controversy arising from incompetent advice given by some postal employees who many times learns in indirect way of the state law that a newspaper is considered a gift. This law is on the statute books of many states but is in direct conflict with the general postal laws of the United States and does not stand. However it has been misquoted in many instances and is aimed at only one grade of publisher and that is the man who gets your name from unknown sources and commences to send you the paper without your order or the order of a friend who has paid and is sending it to you as a gift. In this case the government makes a sample copy provision that governs this and every reputable publisher has to abide very close to the Postal Laws and Rules or lose his right to mail his papers under second class rules. If you don't want a paper notify the publisher and if he fails to discontinue the paper, tell your postmaster the next time you get the paper and return it to him and he will at once make out a slip and mail it to the publisher with the notice to stop the paper. If the paper is not stopped in three weeks, all papers must be remailed back to the publisher by the postmaster with a special slip demanding postage due of 1c. This is your right under the law and thus protects you against the publisher who seeks to build up a large subscription list against your wishes. In this way the publisher is protected and so are you. If you continue take the paper out of the office you are legally bound to pay for it just the same as if your grocer left a bill of goods at your door by mistake. If you use the goods you must pay for them. The Law of the Postoffice has ruled on this many times.

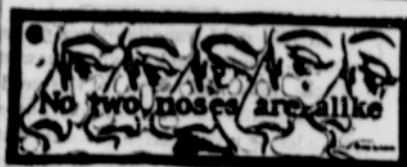
