## Be Careful!

The past month we heard a politician who when asked if he was going to let the people know his views thru his local paper replied that he guessed the people needn't worry, and besides if he told them what he was going to do and put it in print they would make trouble for him if he happened to change his mind. That seems to us to be just the very reason why every man who runs for office should take the people into his confidence and tell them plainly in publicly printed advertising just what he is going to give them if they elect him to office. When such a man does this the people are more willing to trust him, for they know that he has placed himself on record and must do as his ads claim. If a candidate will not place his promises in public print it looks very suspicious. Such a man never wants to let the people have any strings on him and takes the old time excuse as his motto, "If I can't be elected without pledges, I don't want the office." If there is another man whom you know personally, vote for him instead. If there is no one whom you know, take the man who is not afraid to tell you in the public press just what he is going to do for you and yours. You have at least the chance of holding him to his public promises. There are a few candidates this fall who have assumed the air of "The public be damned" and such men are those who have not or will not make a public promise to the voters. Be careful, voters, and keep these men at home where they belong.

## Stop! Look! Listen!

The past few weeks has seen several of the politicians in Gold Hill visiting the voters. Some of them have a fairly honest story to tell the people whose votes they desire. Others deal in ambiguous statements that sound big but mean nothing. Now Mr. or Mrs. Voter, do you ever stop to analyze the promises of the average candidate for office? Do you look him in the eye and ask yourself if you would trust him with your purse? Do you think of him as a man that you would want to enforce the laws that protect you and your little ones? Very few of you do. There are some, but very few. 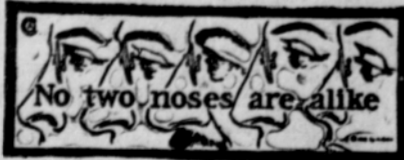

ACCORDING to the ruling of the Oregon Dairy and Food Commission all dairy butter sold or exposed for sale in this state must be wrapped in butter paper upon which is printed the words "OREGON DAIRY BUTTER, 16 (or 32) ounces full weight," with the name and address of the maker.

To enable patrons of this paper to easily comply with this ruling we have put in a supply of the standard sizes of butter paper and will print it in lots of 100 sheets and upward and deliver it by parcels post at the following prices:

100 Sheets, 16 or 32 ounces \$1.35

250 Sheets, 16 or 32 ounces \$1.85

500 Sheets, 16 or 32 ounces \$2.65

Send your orders to us by mail accompanied by the price of the paper and it will be promptly forwarded to you by parcel post, prepaid.
