SAMS VALLEY AND THE HIGH SCHOOL

Some few weeks ago a meeting was held at the Gold Hill Hotel Dining room at which time suggestions were made looking toward the betterment of High school conditions in this city and our neighboring community of Sams Valley. At that meeting it was the editor of the News who suggested that we arrange, if possible, a meeting with the citizens of Sams Valley and that we as representatives of Gold Hill meet the citizens and tax payers of that thriving community and have a good friendly meeting and ascer-

tain the wishes of our neighbors.

In doing this we had several things in mind. The two communities have many things in common and some, which if properly persecuted, would mean the betterment and enrichment of both. The matter of schools was the topic of the evening at the hotel and, as practically all the rest in attendance there we felt that whatever was best for Sams Valley would be the thing we would work for. Personally we would prefer to see not one Sams Valley student in our schools than to invoke any antipathy toward our town in that community. The profits to either place would not merit the loss of any friendship.

No insinuations against the teaching force of Sams Valley were hinted at by anyone, so far as we know. Any two teachers who can conduct a full high school curriculum have too much ability to ever stop long in a community where the compensation is so small as it is in the average small community. It is a big task and it requires much application and sacrifice on the part of such teachers. Instead of being condemned we would rather be inclined to commend the efforts of the Sams Valley instructors. We are sure, however, that even the teachers in that school realize that they cannot give all that a high school student should have. It would be a physical impossibility. Neither can the present teaching force in the local school, and here we have four. Laboratory work, Vocational training, domestic arts,

physical education, music and many other important side lines must be overlooked in any small school to a more or less extent. The absolutely basic studies which are required for college entry might be handled by a small school but when we pay for something we want something good. Anyone would and why should they not.

There is developing in the Sams Valley community, we fear, an ill feeling which we hope is unwarranted. We would like to see it checked before it goes further, and arrives at a place where it will hamper good cooperative work which our two communities must work together on in the future.

Of Interest to Women

Waffles

For four people sift together two cups of flour, one-half teaspoonful of salt, and two tablespoonsful of sugar. Into this stir enough milk to make a pouring batter. Then add two yolk of egg beaten light, four tablespoonsful of melted butter, and two teaspoonfuls of baking powder. Stir in two teaspoonfuls of baking powder and just before folding in the whites of two eggs beaten stiff. In this way the batter begins to rise and is just right for immediate use. The crispness of waffles may be increased by adding shortening.

Pasteurizing

Milk and cream for ordinary use or milk for babies may be successfully pasteurized at home. The process is not difficult and requires only simple equipment. Farmers Bulletin 1359 "Milk and Its Uses in the Home" gives a full description of the method and equipment.

Milk Strains

In removing milk strains use cold or lukewarm water first, sponging carefully if the garment cannot be laundered. This removes the protein, which hot water coagulates and sets. Afterwards follow with hot water and soap on washable materials, or with chloroform, gasoline, carbon tetrachloride or some other greases solvent if laundering would injure the fabric.

Best Rice

Boil rice in a large quantity of water until tender, then pour it into a colander or sieve to drain, cover with a clean cloth and put in in a warm oven or over a vessel of hot water. A it steams each grain swells and becomes separate.

Tarnish

Tarnish on silver can be removed by the electrolytic method. Various commercial devices for this can be bought for use at home, or it can be done in following way: Fill an enameled or agateware kettle partly full of water in which has been dissolved 1 teaspoon of either washing soda or baking soda and 1 teaspoon salt to each quart of water, heat this solution to the boiling point, put in strips of aluminum or bright zinc, add the tarnished silver, and boil it. The silver must be covered completely by the water and each piece must be in contact with the aluminum or zinc, either directly or through other silver. When the tarnish has disappeared, the silver should be removed from the kettle, washed, and dried with a clean, soft cloth. —402-27.

Department of the Interior United States Land Office, Roseburg Oregon, December 28, 1926. Notice is hereby given that the General Land Office, by Commissioner's letter of December 21, 1926, has returned to entry under the homestead or desert land laws the E½ of SW¼ of Sec. 8, and SW¼ NW¼ of Sec. 18. 35 S. R 1 B, W. M., and the NE¼ NE¼ of Sec 22, Tp 35 S. R 1 W, W. M., containing 161.55 acres.

The restoration will take effect January 18, 1927, at 9 o'clock A. M., and ex-service men of the late war with Germany will have preference right of entry for 91 days from and including that date, or until April 1927. Applications of ex-service men of the late war for homestead entry may be executed and filed in this office within 20 days prior to the date of restoration, and all applications for said land filed in this office from December 29, 1926 including 9 o'clock A. M. on January 18, 1927, shall be considered as filed simultaneously and the right to enter will be determined by drawing
