Notice is hereby given that an election has been called by the Board of directors of the Gold Hill Irrigation District, of Jackson County, Oregon, and the said election will be held on the 6th day of May 1927, between the hours of eight o'clock a. m. and five o'clock p. m. for the purpose of voting upon and determining whether or not the Gold Hill Irrigation District of Jackson County, Oregon, shall issue bonds in the amount of ten-thousand dollars (\$10,000.00) in addition to bonds in the amount of ninety-five thousand dollars (\$95,000.00) already voted, for the purposes necessary or convenient in carrying out the provisions of a certain act passed by the General Assembly of the State of Oregon 1921, Section 7323.

The Board of Directors of School District No. 57, of Jackson County, Oregon, at a special meeting thereof, to be held at the office of the clerk in the City of Gold Hill, Oregon, on Monday evening April 25, 1927, at 8 o'clock P. M., will receive sealed bids for the transportation of public school pupils from the outlying sections of said school district, to and from its school building in said City of Gold Hill, Oregon, subject to the following conditions and specifications:

There shall be three (3) transportation routes, known respectively as the Kanes Creek Route, Galls Creek Route and the Sardine Creek-Colony Route, the same being more particularly described as follows:

The Kanes Creek Route commencing at the intersection of the Pacific Highway and Jacksonville Kanes Creek Highway just south of Gold Hill, and running on said highway via the Foley Lane to the Gold Hill Jacksonville Highway; thence southerly on said highway to the border of said district No. 57, on said Gold Hill-Jacksonville Highway up to the Old Mardon place and returning on said highway entering Gold Hill, via 4th, Ave., north to the school building in Gold Hill.

The Galls Creek Route—Leaving Gold Hill on the east and going up the Galls Creek Road to the Teague ranch leaving the O. R. Eaton ranch not later than 8:00 o'clock on each and every trip of such transportation and arrive at said school building not later than 8:45 o'clock a. m. on said trip. Thence each and every trip running from the O. E. Teague ranch on the Galls Creek road to where the Galls Creek road intersects the Kanes Creek highway, ranch and thence back on the same thence running north to the Hamner route to Gold Hill Oregon returning up to the W. W. Hittle place and into Gold Hill Oregon to said school building of said District No. 57.

The Sardine Creek-Colony Route—Commencing on the border line of said school district on the Sardine Creek Highway and running thence on said highway to the Pacific Highway, and thence north to the S. A. Dusenberry ranch, and thence westerly on said Pacific Highway to the Cy Fleming ranch on said highway, thence returning on said Pacific Highway to the school building in Gold Hill, Oregon.

All bids shall be submitted on the basis of a separate bid sum for each and every route herein specified for the transportation of a maximum of twenty-five (25) school pupils on each route above mentioned, with a separate bid sum per capita for all school pupils above said stipulated number for each route, but all bids so made must be submitted together and at the same time.

All school busses provided for the transportation of pupils shall be equipped with enclosed factory built bodies, the nature and character of said equipment to be specified in detail in each bid submitted; the board expressly reserving the right to award a contract on the basis of the nature and character of the equipment stated as well as price.

The time for delivering pupils to the said school building and the time for departing therewith and therefrom shall be agreed upon at the time of executing a contract, but shall not be later than 8:45 in the morning nor later than 15 minutes after dismissal of school hours.

The successful bidder accepted by the board shall enter into a written contract with the school district, and the same shall among other things especially provide as follows:

For transportation of school pupils on school days for a period of five years.

The successful bidder shall furnish operator's and drivers licenses for all busses employed as well as the state vehicle licenses and all other licenses and taxes required, at the bidder's expense.

That the Board shall at all times reserve the right to dismiss a driver or drivers for incompetency, or other good cause.

That the school year, or the hours of school study may be changed and that the successful bidder will agree thereto and arrange with the board for the transportation of pupils accordingly. The routes herein mentioned may also be changed by the mutual agreement of contractor and the board.

form and manner prescribed by the board. The board expressly reserves the right to accept or reject any and all bids. That the successful bidder shall take out and maintain the usual liability policy for the transportation of school pupils, and pay for the same.
