## Of Interest to Women

**Spanish Beans**  
Soak one-half pound of Cicer beans in water over night or for five hours at least. Then cook them for two hours in salted water. Bring them to a quick boil, that is, then reduce the heat and finish cooking. If the water has not cooked away, drain the beans and serve with the following sauce.

In one cupful of olive oil fry one finely chopped green pepper and one large onion, season with a small pinch of thyme and allspice and add two tablespoonfuls of minced salmon and two minced anchovies, one small can of tomato paste and a mere suggestion of cayenne pepper. Served with a salad it makes an excellent meal.

**Eggplant Armenian Style**  
Peel and slice one large eggplant and reduce to small cubes. Sprinkle with salt and let stand for an hour or so. Drain, dry and fry until nearly tender. Then drain off most of the fat and arrange a layer of the fried eggplant in the bottom of the pan. Over this pour a mixture made of one-half pound of grated domestic cheese, one tablespoonful of finely chopped parsley, one teaspoonful of meat flavoring sauce and two eggs. Alternate a layer of eggplant and the mixture until both are used up and let cook slowly for about twenty minutes. When hot heat third egg and pour over it and let set. Then remove to a platter, squeeze the juice of one over it and serve.

**Scotch Rizzard**  
Pick an appropriate-size haddie and heat on the skin side so the meat may be easily removed. Cut the fish in pieces and soak in hot water for twenty-five minutes. Drain and rinse with hot water and place in a saucepan and cover with fresh hot water, add a bay leaf, a tiny pinch of allspice, thyme and sage and boil for fifteen minutes. While this is cooking melt three tablespoonfuls of butter and add to it one tablespoonful of chopped parsley, one small onion and the juice of one-half lemon. Drain the fish and place on a hot platter and spread the seasoned butter paste over it. Serve with boiled white potatoes and salad.
