Meat with flecks of fat throughout is more tender and has more juice than cuts without any fat. If meat cuts are not fresh, they will have dark dry edges.

Good cuts of beef are edged with straw colored fat, are firm, and have fine grain muscle. Poor beef has loose, flabby flesh, is dark color with yellow oily fat.

Select cuts, which come from those parts of the animal which receive least exercise, are muscular with little connective tissue. These are better when cooked by dry heat. The chief methods are broiling, pan-broiling, roasting, pan frying and frying.

A new sandwich filling is made by creaming 1 teaspoonful of butter, adding one small cream cheese, mixing thoroughly. Stir in 2 table-spoonfuls of strained honey. Pare and cut one large apple, slice in thin slices and put into the mixture. Spread on light or dark sandwich bread. White bread may be toasted.

If milk is kept in a large shallow basin instead of a deep one, it will remain sweet much longer.
