HOME POINTERS

(From School of Home Economics)

The secret of satisfactory packing of lunch boxes are to keep all flavors separate and to prevent the foods being mashed. This can be done by the use of waxed paper, or jars with lids.

A pumpkin hollowed out and filled with fruits makes a very attractive center piece. Autumn leaves around the base of the pumpkin add to the appearance.

A colorful decoration for omelet or roast lamb is made by placing thin slices of mint jelly over thin slices of orange around the dish.

Soups served at luncheon or supper are usually cream soups, because they furnish real food value. Bouillon and consommé have little food value, but act as an appetizer.

Toast points makes a good garnish for scrambled eggs or creamed dishes. The bread is cut in small triangles and toasted, then placed around the food with the points towards the outside.

Raw cauliflower makes an excellent salad when cut in small pieces, marinated and combined with chopped pimientos or green peppers, chives, and diced tomatoes.
