Floyd B. Willard who was formerly professor of our city schools for three years, has been visiting his many friends here. He is now teaching at Hill's Military Academy.

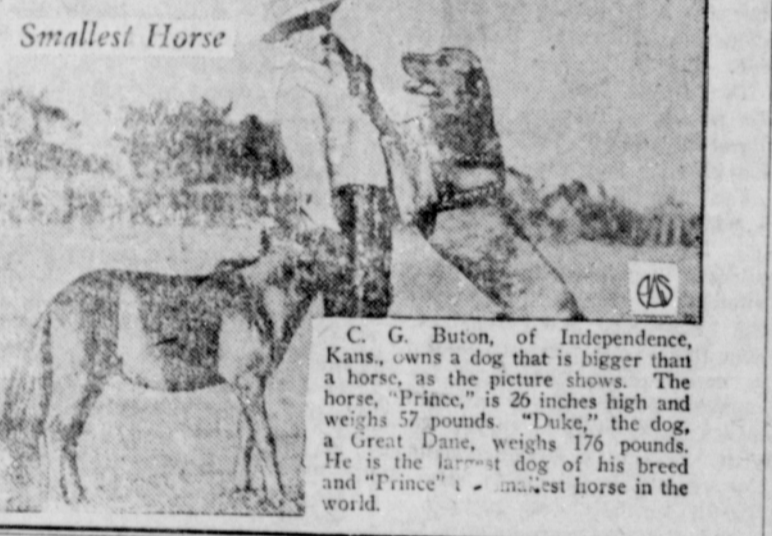
Mrs. Price of Medford spent the week end visiting her mother, Mrs. Osborne.
