## AN ORDINANCE

WHEREAS, the condition of that certain building in the City of Gold Hill, situated on Lot 1 and 2, Block 16 and also the building located on lots 10 and 11, Block 14, according to the official and recorded plat of said city, has become a menace to the inhabitants of said city because of the dilapidated and unsafe condition of the walls of the said buildings;

NOW, THEREFORE, the people of the City of Gold Hill do ordain as follows:

Section 1. That the brick building situated on Lots 10 and 11, Block 14, according to the official and recorded plat of the City of Gold Hill, because of the unsafe and dilapidated condition of the brick walls of said buildings, have become a nuisance and a menace to the citizens of Gold Hill, and is hereby declared to be a nuisance.

Section 2. That the City Recorder of the City of Gold Hill be, and he hereby is instructed to notify the owner or owners of said buildings by registered letter addressed to the last known place of address of the owner or owners of said buildings that the same has been declared by the City of Gold Hill to be a nuisance and that for the public safety that it is necessary to have the said buildings removed because of their dilapidated and unsafe condition; that the said City

Recorder be further directed to notify the said owner or owners of said building that unless the same is removed or placed in a safe condition by the owner or owners of said buildings, that the City of Gold Hill have to remove said buildings as a matter of safety to its citizens.

Section 3. That the owner or owners of said buildings shall be given by said notice a period of 15 days within which to remove the said buildings or place them in a state of repair so that the same will not be a menace to the citizens of Gold Hill.

Section 4. That if the owner or owners of said building shall fail to remove said building within the said period of time herein specified, that the City Marshall of the City of Gold Hill be, and hereby is instructed to procure such assistance as shall be necessary to remove said building and that the said removal may be done by tearing down the said brick walls of said building.

Section 5. That inasmuch as the safety of the citizens of Gold Hill is involved, an emergency is hereby declared to exist and this ordinance shall be in full force and effect immediately from and after its passage by the City Council and its approval by the Mayor.
