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Hanby, Experiences Educator, Seeks Co. Supt. Office

A. J. Hanby, republican candidate for nomination as county superintendent in the spring primaries, was visiting residents of this end of the county, in the interests of his candidacy last week-end.

Mr. Hanby, who has been an instructor in the Medford schools for the past twenty years, is well known in this section also, having been principal of the Gold Hill schools for two years, early in his career, then going to Central Point, where he was principal for seven years, organizing the high school there.

During his twenty years in the Medford schools he has held various positions, progressing from principalship of the elementary school to similar service in the Junior high school, and is now serving as history instructor in Medford high. He was reelected to this post for another year at the annual election of teachers this spring.

During these many years of teaching, Mr. Hanby has never missed a day from his school duties.

Mr. Hanby came to Oregon from Kansas, where he had graduated from high school, Standard Normal and Fairmount college, all in Wichita, Kansas. He has been a taxpayer in Jackson county ever since establishing residence in the county.

According to forest service data there are 49 highways included in the system. The total length is 1372 miles of which 880 miles are within Oregon's fourteen national forests. Cost of the system to date has been \$16,000,000, and it is estimated that an additional \$16,400,000 will be required to complete it.

These forest highways lie for the most part in the back country, affording better protection as well as opening up Oregon's forest wonderland for use and enjoyment. They are located throughout the state both in eastern and western Oregon. There are fourteen national forests in this state and each has its quota of forest highways, it is said.

The secretary's notice provides that the system may be added to or revised, following the procedure specified in department regulations.

The forest highway system for the state of Washington was first approved by the secretary on June 14, 1923, and was entirely revised on December 4, 1931. The Washington system embraces 30 highways, a total of 733 miles, of which 502 miles are inside Washington's eight national forests. The cost to date is \$6,500,000, and estimated cost to complete the system is \$13,000,000, according to the forest service.

A total of 197 forest campsites has been laid out by the U. S. forest service in Oregon's 14 national forests and 145 in Washington's 8 national forests.

Oregon's Forest Highway System Approved

A forest highway system has been agreed upon and approved for the first time for the State of Oregon, according to notice just received from the Secretary of Agriculture by Regional Forester C. J. Buck, Portland, Oregon.

The state highway commission of Oregon, the U. S. bureau of public roads, and the U. S. forest service have all approved the system, according to Mr. Buck.

Forest highways are defined as "roads of primary importance to the state, counties or communities, within or adjacent to the national forests." They are financed jointly, the federal government contributing approximately 50 per cent, and the
