

Colorful Celebration to Mark Dedication of the Rogue River Bridge

Gold Beach, Oregon, May 12. One of the most colorful celebrations ever held in the Northwest will take place in Gold Beach, Saturday, May 28, when the great reinforced concrete bridge spanning the Rogue will be formally dedicated and the scenic Oregon Coast highway will be opened to traffic throughout its 410 miles from Astoria to the Oregon-California state line.

There will be many bands of music, uniformed marching organizations and numerous special features. The caravan coming from Astoria and proceeding south on the Oregon Coast Highway, will be accompanied by the famous Seaside High School girls band. With the Marshfield delegation will be the national guard coast artillery band. Coquille is sending a band of 35 pieces and Bandon Concert band of 30 pieces and a big chorus will accompany the Bandon delegation.

From the Redwood Empire district in California, the Crescent City delegation will bring a band and Grants Pass, the northern terminus of the Redwood Empire will be represented by its famous organization of Cave Men.

Indications point to a tremendous throng at the celebration. Communities along the Oregon Coast Highway are organizing for participation. Astoria, where the caravan from the north will form will be represented by one of the largest delegations ever sent out by that city for a like event. As this caravan proceeds south over the Oregon Coast Highway, it will be augmented by additional delegations from communities along the highway and from the interior of the state.

The Redwood Empire association with headquarters in San Francisco, is organizing for participation. Reports received from many communities in the Redwood Empire district indicate that a vast throng from the south will be here. Eureka is sending a large number and Crescent City will turn out strong. As far south as San Francisco, delegations are being organized to come to Gold Beach for the celebration.

The Oregon Coast Highway and the Redwood Highway will be in their spring garb for the celebration. Miles upon miles of rhododendrons, azaleas and other flowering shrubs and plants will be putting on a spring show. This great floral display will make the trip either from the north or the south a real treat to the motorist.

Gold Beach is organizing to entertain its visitors. Although small in population, Gold Beach inhabitants are noted for their hospitality, and they are going to do their utmost on this occasion to stage a real old-time celebration with many early day features.

In 1921 a total of 1,100 people visited the Oregon Caves in the Siskiyou national forest in Oregon, and in 1931 the number was 28,912, the forest service reports.
