Shasta-Cascade Association Attracting Tourists North

Taking an aggressive step forward in the attempt to get travel into the Northern part of California and the Southern part of Oregon, two men were placed at work today at important points to inform tourists of the great scenic attractions in this section, by the Shasta-Cascade Wonderland association in conjunction with eight other organizations.

These offices will be located at Salt Lake City and Los Angeles where complete information will be available concerning all the attractions of this Wonderland area. Tourists will be given details of what they may see and do and details of roads and places to stop. Illustrated talks will be made by the representatives before public bodies, press releases and motor-logues will be arranged for the newspapers, and radio programs will be broadcast over important stations.

The Shasta-Cascade Wonderland consists of four Northern California and four Southern Oregon counties.

Closed Season On Slash Fires Now In Effect

Setting of fires in any forest land, grass, grain or stubble, is unlawful during the closed season.

from May 15 to October 1, except where a permit has been secured from the forester or a warden, it was pointed out by Dwight L. Phipps, district fire warden.

In addition to the requirements for setting of fires, the Oregon laws also forbid throwing away of any lighted tobacco, cigars, cigarettes, matches, firecrackers or other lighted material on any forest land, private road, public highway or railroad right of way during the

closed season.

Firms or persons engaged in logging or wood cutting, thereby creating a fire hazard, are required to remove such hazard each year by burning the annual slash, unless relieved by the state forester. Such burning is to be conducted in accordance with the act requiring permission.

Permits may be obtained by calling the state fire patrol headquarters, in Medford.

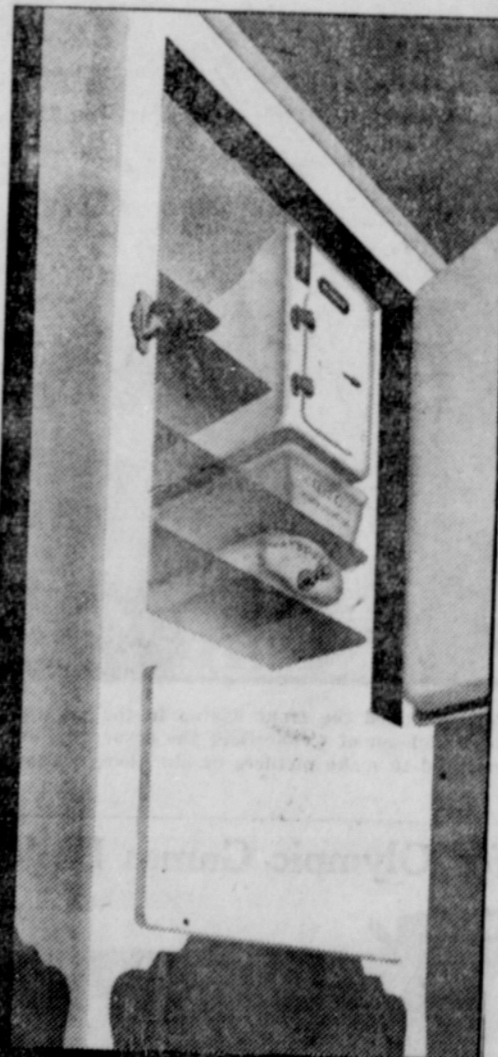
The ball grounds on the S. P. reserve will have to be removed as the company needs additional room for their new switches.

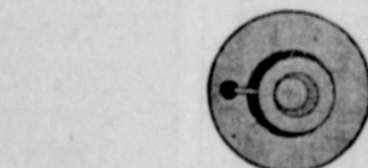
