### Work On Highway Nearing Completion

The two bridges being constructed over Bear creek north of Ashland in the building of the new highway unit were finished Wednesday of this week. Hand rails on both bridges and walks on one are the only additions to be made. Wednesday also saw the grading of the road completed and work on paving will be started immediately. Cement for the 20-foot wide concrete paving is beginning to arrive there from Gold Hill from the Beaver Portland Cement company. The work will require 25,000 bags of cement, each bag containing 100 lbs. of cement. Twenty-six railway cars will be required to transfer the cement to Ashland.
