Court Term Opening Is Postponed Until Mon.

The circuit court term scheduled to open in Medford Monday was postponed until next Monday, September 25, due to the Circuit Judge H. D. Norton being delayed with cases in Josephine county.

The jury list for the coming term will be drawn from the 20 names remaining on the old panel, exhausted during the ballot theft trials. If further veniremen are required they will be drawn by the sheriff from the tax rolls of the county in the manner prescribed by law. Most of the original jury list was exhausted by reason of disqualifications, which included death, physical defects, removal from the county or other legal reasons.

Civil actions are listed as first to be called. Many are minor actions, which can be heard without calling a jury. Some are equity cases and will be heard without a jury.

It is the plan of the court to call

criminal matters when opportunity offers.

Criminal cases on the docket include Mrs. Henrietta B. Martin, president of the self-styled "Good Government Congress," indicted for "riotous conduct," and her father, C. H. Brown, indicted for "slandering a bank."

Other cases on the criminal calendar include Fred Wolf, Birdseye creek rancher, indicted for manslaughter, Mervyn (Sonny) Gleason, Central Point indicted for assault and battery; Clarence Day and Thomas King, indicted for larceny of livestock; Thomas Price and W. L. Ray indicted for violation of the mining engineer code, and Joe Cave, city policeman, indicted for involuntary manslaughter.

Burglar Working on Court-House Lawn Tries Getaway

Earl Thompson, transient youth held in the county jail awaiting sentence on his plea of guilty to burglarizing the office of Dr. B. C. Wilson, walked away from the courthouse lawn, where he was employed Thursday afternoon in removing the top covering of dirt. State police are investigating Thompson's past on the theory he has a crime record.

The state police captured Thompson at the state line Thursday evening, and returned him to the county jail. The fugitive was in charge of William Tetherow, who is superintending the excavating. Thompson was granted permission to leave the work, and failed to return.

Two other county jail inmates were engaged Friday in shoveling on the lawn in order to make it ready for grass seeding, and shrub and floral improvements.—Mail Tribune.

Pioneer Resident of Jacksonville Dies Sat.

Mrs. Lizzie Cronemiller, native of Jacksonville, died at her home in Jacksonville Saturday morning, September 16.

Her husband, James C. Cronemiller passed away some years ago. He was a well known and honored citizen of Jackson county. Her father, H. B. Helms came to Jacksonville in 1856, was married April 26, 1862 to Augusta Engelbrecht. Lizzie was born April 28, 1863. She was for many years a member of the Presbyterian church of this city. She leaves to mourn her loss, one son, David of Jacksonville; one sister Mrs. Anna Bland, of Portland, Oregon, and one brother Harry Helms, of Jacksonville.

Services were held in the Jacksonville cemetery under the direction of Rev. S. E. Jones of the Presbyterian church, the pastor and an old friend of the family. Local members of the Eastern Star read the ritual of the order at the grave.
