### GOVERNOR MEIER NOT TO RUN FOR REELECTION

In a statement issued over the radio Saturday evening Governor Julius Meier announced that he would not be a candidate for re-election to the governorship. In the same talk he told of the accomplishments made while he has been governor, adding "I have served honorably and unselfishly." He also told how "every pledge" of his platform was fulfilled.

### Rail Surcharge Off for Balance of Year

When western railroads on December 1 announced elimination of surcharge on Pullman accommodations for a six month's trial period ending May 31, they took a step which has proven so popular with the traveling public that decision has been reached to extend the elimination period for the balance of the year 1934, according to advice received by J. A. Ormandy, general passenger agent of the Southern Pacific company. Cancellation of the surcharge reduced Pullman rates one-third and is credited by railroad officials as being one of the principal factors in bringing about the improved passenger business which the western lines are now enjoying.
