Land Sales Continue  
to Set High Record

"Back to the land" has been more than a fanciful slogan, in the experience of the land liquidating division of the Federal Land bank of Spokane. For in each successive month all during the fall and winter period, the bank has established one new record after another in the sale of properties it has been forced to acquire from borrowers.

After setting an all-time record in 1934 by marketing farms to the value of \$2,560,000, the liquidating department is off to an even better start this year with sales of \$234,500 in January. Not only is this the largest January volume in the bank's history, but down payments showed a gain of 100 per cent over January last year.

"I believe this sales record is the best barometer of all to demonstrate that Pacific northwest agriculture is getting back," says Ward K. Newcomb, vice president of the Land bank. "It has been my observation, after a pretty long acquaintance with farming conditions, that when money starts going into land it is a good sign of returning confidence

all around. I feel that such is the case now. Land values are rising gradually and the farm once more is being regarded as an attractive form of investment.

"The Land bank, of course, is an unwilling possessor of the properties it has been forced to acquire, and desires to return them to individual management as promptly as suitable buyers can be found—on terms aimed at helping experienced operators establish a permanent home and make good."

World's Lighting Progress  
Great During Half Century

Modern home lighting, with its many benefits to comfort and health, has reached its present high degree of development within the short space of a half century.

Since Thomas Edison perfected the incandescent lamp, thereby revolutionizing the lighting systems of the world, the problem of illumination has virtually been reduced to an exact science.

It is significant that such great strides have been taken within less than 100 years, when the rise of electric illumination is compared with the countless centuries embraced in the evolution of the world's former lighting equipment.

Since man first learned to kindle fire, lighting has undergone change after change with steady improvement. Came next the candle with the addition of a wick, which served for centuries as man's most effective light form. Slight advancement was gained by the researches of Benjamin Franklin, who first established the fact that two wicks produced more than twice the light of one. From candles, the next step was to gas as a form of illumination.

With Edison the entire civilized world changed its lighting system practically over night. Today lighting is regulated, controlled, dispensed in a legion of ways. Searchlights send beams for miles through space. Streets are "gay white ways" at night. Every home is steadily being transformed as better, more health-

ful, more efficient lamps and lighting systems are evolved.

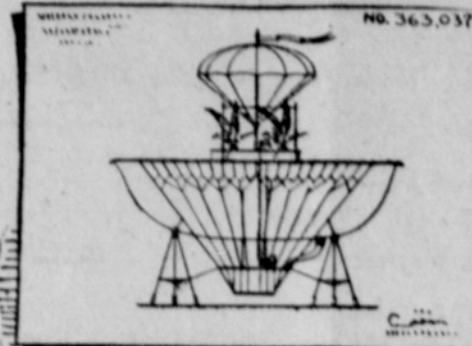

200,000 YEARS SPENT

SAN DIEGO, Calif., Feb. 12—Two hundred thousand years ago exhibits were being fabricated for America's Exposition-1935.

They are original stone implements made by men of the Cro-Magnon, Neanderthal, Pittdown and Neolithic ages; and they have been acquired from the field museum of Chicago as part of the permanent exhibit of the Palace of Science at the California Pacific International exposition according to Malcolm Rogers, director.

In exchange for these rare specimens of ancient handiwork, Rogers has presented to the Chicago

museum an equally valuable collection of stone tools used by California Indians of bygone ages.

More than 60,000 specimens will be on display in the anthropology division of America's Exposition-1935.
