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PWA Grants Awarded To State Institutions

Grants of PWA funds for construction of an infirmary at Oregon State college, to cost \$100,000 and gymnasiums at the Oregon Normal school and Southern Oregon Normal school to cost \$54,000 and \$45,000 respectively, have been approved by officials at Washington, according to a telegram received at the office of the chancellor of higher education. Confirmation of the grants was also received at Eugene from the PWA officials in Portland.

In each case 30 per cent of the actual cost of construction will be an outright grant from the federal government and the balance will be in the form of a loan to be repaid over a long period of time from student building fees.

With the approval of these three projects, all applications submitted by the state board of higher education have been accepted, with the exception of the infirmary proposed for the University of Oregon. Final action on this has been held up pending action on a bill before the legislature. The infirmary planned for the university will cost \$100,000. The university library to cost \$350,000 and the Eastern Oregon Normal training school have already been approved.

The new infirmary at the college will provide for the first time adequate facilities for this purpose. At the present, a remodeled fraternity house, some distance from the campus, is used. The gymnasium at Ashland will be the first unit of a physical education and classroom building. The Monmouth structure will be one story, to provide health and physical education facilities, replacing a wholly inadequate building in use at present.

Large Gain Noted in Ford Deliveries Over Last Year

Domestic retail deliveries of Ford V-8 passenger cars and trucks for January totaled 75,678 units, an increase of 110 per cent over deliveries for the same month of 1934, it was announced this week at the home offices of the Ford Motor company. This is the highest total for

any January in the past five years. It also exceeds deliveries in the combined months of January and February of last year.

Deliveries in January this year were exceeded in only three months in 1934. They were April, May and June, which are usually considered the peak months of the spring selling season.

Retail deliveries of Ford V-8 trucks were higher than for any January since 1925.

The Ford company recently announced its January world production of V-8 cars and trucks totaled 105,230 units. Domestic production for February has been set to exceed that of January.

Present production of Ford V-8 units is in excess of 5,000 daily.

May Build Norman Village For French Exhibit

France may build a Norman Village as its exhibit in the California Pacific International Exposition, which opens in San Diego, California May 29.

This was indicated today following inspection of the exposition grounds in Balboa Park by Ernest J. Guy, San Francisco, trade commissioner of France.

Mr. Guy discussed the contemplated reproduction of a typical Norman village with Frank Drugan, executive secretary of the exposition and other officials. The village shops would contain exhibits of various industries of France, the little town being populated by native French people, furnishing a touch of old world color to the exposition.

The trade commissioner was greatly impressed with the possibilities afforded by the exposition for displays of French commerce and trade.

New OSC Spray Calendar Ready for Fruit Growers

In spite of all its limitations and the searches for a substitute, arsenate of lead still remains the most satisfactory material for use in codling moth control, though calcium arsenate is being used successfully in the Willamette valley, says the 1935 issue of the Oregon apple annual spray recommendation bulletin just issued by the O. S. C. extension service.

The 1935 edition is now ready for free distribution and may be had from county agents' offices or direct from Corvallis. It differs little from the 1934 issue, and those having the latter may safely follow its guidance, officials state, until the new one is obtained.

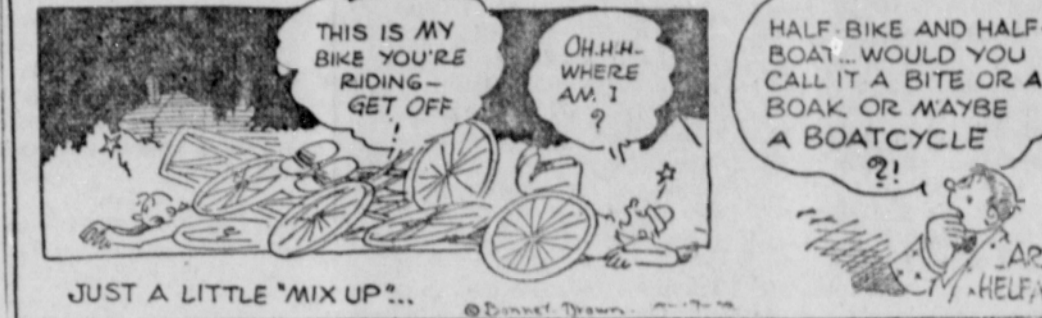

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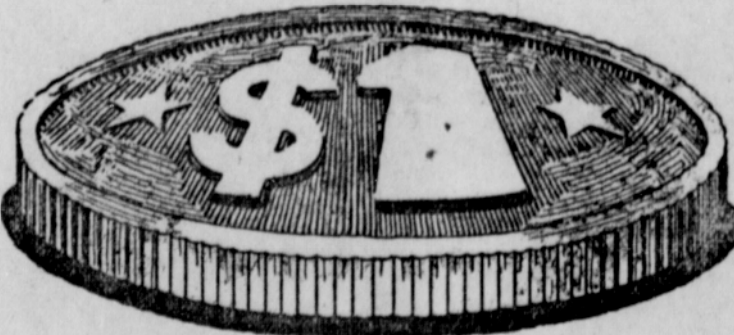
