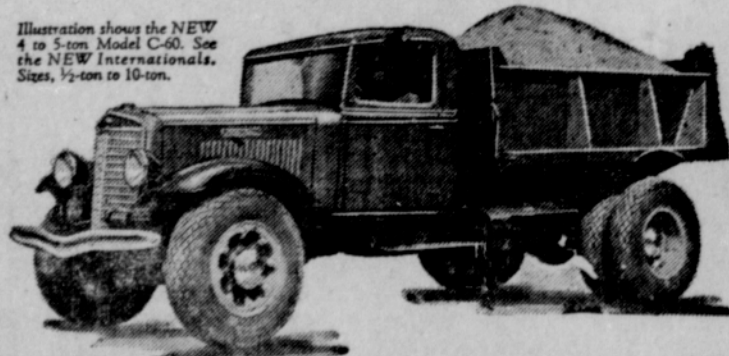

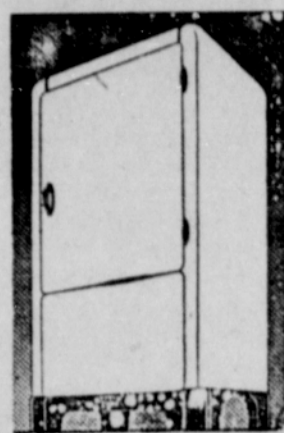
Mr. and Mrs. Walter Noble have moved from the Walter Dungey home to the home formerly occupied by Wm. Puhl.
