BRIEF BITS OF NEWS FROM HERE AND THERE

California, with 5,600,000 popula-
tion, has more than twice as many
automobiles as Germany with a
population of 65,000,000. Los An-
geles county alone, the county in
which Los Angeles is located, has
more automobiles than Germany.

Not a single person was killed in
a railroad train accident in the
United States during 1935.

Letuce from the Salt River Val-
ley of Arizona is shipped into every
state in the Union and Canada.
Two crops are grown each year, one
in the spring, and one in the fall.

The Santa Fe streamline train,
the Super Chief, of eight coaches is
constructed of stainless steel. The
train cost \$550,000 and the Diesel
Locomotive with which it is operat-
ed cost \$360,000 or a total of \$910-
000. The running time between Chi-
cago and Los Angeles, a distance of
2,225 miles is made in 39 hours and
45 minutes or an average speed of
55 miles an hour including stops.
The trip will be made once each
way each week.

A series of experiments have
been made by the United Air Lines
in which air planes have been
flown and landed without the aid
of a pilot. The control is maintain-
ed by two radio beams of currents.
In 250 trials planes were landed
without the aid of a pilot and per-
fect landings were made.
