A mechanical cotton picker invented by John and Mack Rust was given a practical demonstration recently at Stoneville, Mississippi. It did in eight hours what ordinarily would requre 82 men to do in the same time. The owners announce that they will lease the machines and not sell them. Objections to the mechanical picker are that it will throw out of employment a great number of people who have no other employment, that it gathers some leaves and foreign matter and lowers the grade of the pick, that it can only be operated on level ground. Since 1850 about 2000 applications have been made for patents on mechanical cotton picke and over 1400 patents have be granted. The Rust machine is by f the most successful yet produced.
