

## Household Hints

Set the oven at the highest temperature given, and keep it at that heat for fifteen minutes. Then reduce the heat to the lowest temperature and roast the meat for the length of time given.

Rare, 550 to 400, 15 minutes.

Medium, 550 to 375, 20 minutes.  
Well done, 550 to 350, 25 min.  
Beef Loaf, 375 to 350, 1 1/2 hrs.  
Roast Lamb, 500 to 350, 20 to 25 minutes  
Leg of Lamb, 500 to 350, 20 to 25 minutes  
Pork, 500 to 375, 25 to 30 minutes.  
Veal, 500 to 350, 20 to 30 min.  
Veal Loaf, 350, 2 1/2 hours  
Duck, 500 to 350, 20 to 25 min.  
Goose, 500 to 350, 20 to 25 min.  
Turkey, 500 to 350, 15 to 25 min.

### RECIPES

#### Quick Corn Bread

1 cup cornmeal  
1 cup flour  
2 teaspoons baking powder  
1 tablespoon sugar  
1/2 teaspoon salt  
1 egg  
1 1/2 cups of milk  
4 tablespoons melted shortening  
Sift the first five dry ingredients together. Then add the egg, milk and shortening. Mix well. Pour into a greased shallow pan.  
Bake in a hot oven, 425 degrees, for about twenty minutes.  
Break into squares while hot and serve immediately.

#### Johnny Cake

1 1/2 cups of cornmeal  
1/2 cup of white flour  
1 or 2 eggs  
1 cup of sour milk  
1 level teaspoon soda  
Pinch of salt  
1 teaspoon of sugar  
Bake in a moderate oven in a shallow pan for twenty minutes.  
Serve while it is hot, with syrup.

## TWO MINUTE SERMON

**THE REWARD OF OBEDIENCE:**  
The central theme of the story of Noah is the lesson obedience, obedience to God's will and purpose. The essential law of obedience is woven into every fiber of the universe. The tides as they rise and fall obey a law. The planets in their ageless sweep of the heavens obey a law. Everywhere on all sides is evidence of obedience to law. From infancy man must obey a superior authority. As a child he must obey his parents, and as a man he must obey the civil law. He must obey the law of the physical world. These are not arbitrary dictums laid down merely to stop man from doing the things he desires to do. They are designed for his own good. The parent in asking obedience of the child is not seeking to deprive the child of any privilege but to shield him from the things that experience has taught will harm him. The civil law of the land is not designed to deprive man of any rights justly his but to protect him from injury, injustice and exploitation. In a like but larger sense the law of God is not designed to deprive man of anything that is good, but rather to protect him from the things that the experience of ages has proven will injure and destroy him. As Noah, living in a world that ignored God, chose the path of obedience and through that choice was permitted to escape the deluge, so today the man who chooses to obey God's law and lives in obedience to divine commands can face life's trials and difficulties with a faith and calmness and an assurance that will carry him triumphantly through. This is the reward of obedience.
