## New Forest Area Near Completion

Seventy-five thousand acres of cutover, second growth and isolated farm lands in the Oregon Coast range are being restored to forest production and developed for recreation and wildlife conservation as three years of intensive land use adjustment and acquisition near completion, announces R. S. Shelley, project manager.

Acquisition of 74,882 acres of land on the Oregon Coast, valued at \$428,230 and representing 395 ownerships is approximately 90 percent complete. Lands being acquired are adjacent to and within boundaries of the Siuslaw National Forest.

Development work is being carried on by 540 men in cooperation with WPA. Nine lookout towers have been erected. Carrying out the fire control plan 95 miles of forest roads and 25 miles of trail have been constructed. Communication between lookout towers and other points in the area has been facilitated by the erection of 120 miles of telephone line.

## Make Plans To Bring Tourists West in 1939

State officials and leading Oregon travel and tourist organization men will watch with interest the important phases of a conference in Denver, January 6, where the Inter-mountain states will map their part in a \$3,000,000 campaign to bring tourists West in 1939—year of the Golden Gate International Exposition in San Francisco.

The conference will be the second sectional meeting in the vast campaign inaugurated in Chicago last October by the national major railroads, air and bus lines, the 11 Western states and the World's Fair to make 1939 the greatest travel year in history.

The next sectional conference, it which Oregon, Washington, Idaho, British Columbia and Western Canada will be represented, will be held in Portland or Seattle about the end of January, it was announced by Exposition officials.

Oregon's leading tourist executives and state officials will attend. "See All the West in '39" is the campaign slogan. Transportation groups moving land travel westward will spend approximately \$1,000,000; the Western states will spend \$1,500,000 addition to their regular tourist advertising expenditures and the entire promotion force of the Western Exposition has thrown in its resources to carry out the extensive program.

## Supreme Court Holds Few Acts Unconstitutional

How many acts has the Congress passed and how many of these has the Supreme Court held unconstitutional?

Since its inception nearly 150 years ago, the Congress has passed over 24,000 acts. Of these the Supreme Court has found 76 unconstitutional, according to the Legislative Reference Bureau of the Library of Congress. In only eight cases were entire acts invalidated. In the 68 others only parts of acts were invalidated such as "riders" having little or nothing to do with the main bill, amendments to previous bills, or merely a phrase, clause or section of an entire bill. In these cases the remainder of such acts was not affected.

The acts of Congress invalidated by the Supreme Court were voided because the court held them repugnant to constitutional guarantees of personal liberty, such as trial by jury, unreasonable searches and seizures, self-incrimination, right to confront witnesses, right of contract, designation of offenses, and right of proper hearing for enforcement of penalty.

A Norwegian-American auxiliary has been formed in San Francisco to promote Norwegian representation at the 1939 Golden Gate International Exposition.

## MORE AIRPLANES

Manufacturers of aircraft—one of the nation's newer industrial valued at more than \$71,000,000 during the first eight months of 1937. This was an increase of 69.5 percent over the same period in 1936. Employment in the industry also showed a major increase.

Herbert Hoover has recommended for the Republican party a mid-term Republican National Convention for the purpose of awakening more interest in the party. National committeeman John D. Hamilton has announced that the Republican National committee will meet in Chicago next month to consider the merit and demerits of such a convention and decide whether or not one should be held.

Careful estimates indicate that 4,000,000 tourists will come to California in 1939 for the Golden Gate International Exposition.

The Golden Gate International Exposition, now building for 1939, will use about 30,000,000 board feet of lumber.

Plans for summer ski-jumping on 400-acre Treasure Island are being formulated by the 1939 Golden Gate International Exposition.

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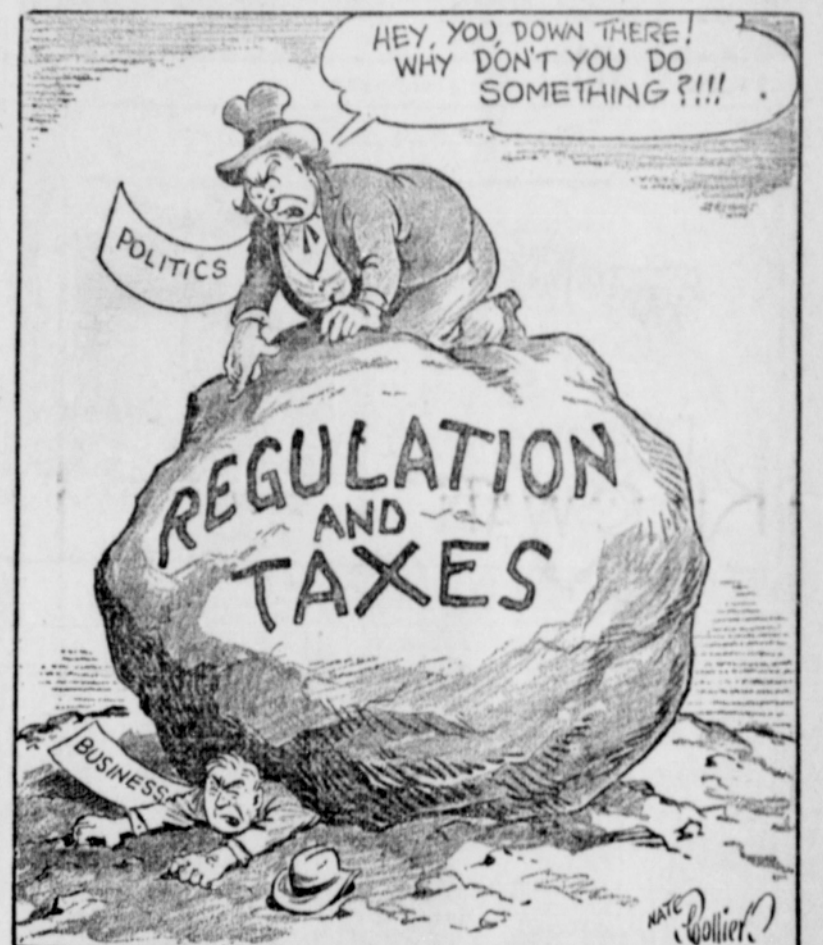
