for their assistance in promoting National Air Mail week, which will begin May 15.

The National Air Mail Week committee arranged a poster contest for the boys and girls in the high schools and grammar schools and institutions having similar courses of study, according to a postmaster H. D. Force, chairman of the Gold Hill committee, directing Air Mail Week preparations in this city.

This contest will close the last day of this month and a few days thereafter the winner in each of the 48 states will be announced.

The state chairman announced that any pupil in grammar or high school classes my compete. He explained that the poster, to be eligible, must relate to the country's air mail service of the present and future and its adaptability to the nation. That allows the contestants a broad opportunity to use their imagination and to demonstrate their artistic talents.

Posters will be judged 50% on originality of the idea; 25% per cent for adaptability to promotion of the air mail service's further development. The poster should be on cardboard twenty by twenty-five inches.

The posters to be entered in the

contest must be mailed, with postage fully prepaid, to the State Chairman, National Air Mail Week Poster Contest, in care of the local postmaster and the postmark must be prior to midnight May 1, 1938.

Right and Truth Inevitable: I happen to be one of those who believe implicitly that the right, and the good, and the just, and the fair, will finally triumph. I believe the liquor question will be settled in the same way — by the final, sensible recognition of the pressure and direction of sound economics. 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What is a Kilowatt?



The kilowatt-hour is a measure of electricity. It is really a giant unit. It is the energy of a horse working for 1 1/3 hours. The horse can do more than the muscle work of 10 men. So a kilowatt-hour is equal to the combined muscle work of 13 strong men in an hour. A kilowatt-hour is 1000 watt-hours just as one foot is 12 inches. A watt-hour is not so small that we should sneer at it. When a 100 pound woman walks from the cellar to the first and second floors, and then to the attic, she is tired, yet her work equals only 1 watt-hour. She would have to make the trip from the cellar to the attic 1000 times to equal the work one kilowatt-hour of electricity does. The average cost of a kilowatt-hour used in the home in the United States is nearly 4 3/4 cents, the average for this company is much less than that. Would you walk from the cellar to the attic 1000 times for less than 4 3/4 cents?
