REVIVAL OF PLACER MINING IN THE WEST

In an effort to revive many old and develop a number of new gold placer mines and locations throughout the west, the Mining Research Bureau, Pasadena, announces a new plan whereby it may be possible for a large number of men and women to participate in a gold

placer project which may have operations extending over seven western states. The plan is a cooperative movement whereby individuals will be gainfully employed on certain placer locations and operate through a cooperative plan whereby each location will be fully equipped with machinery ready to start operations and the persons operating the location will participate in all profits from the operations.

The plan is to be completely financed by a group of public spirited men and women of Pasadena, Beverly Hills and Hollywood who expect no returns from the moneys advanced to start operations. It is estimated that 10,000 persons may avail themselves of this participating interest. The plan has re-

ceived the endorsement of leading engineers and business men all through the western mining localities.

Due to the large number of applicants likely to make requests for locations and in an effort to explain the entire procedure of the plan, the Bureau will start holding meetings the first of May in various portions of the west. Any community desiring to have one of these meetings should make application direct to the Bureau. Arrangements are being made to show the motion picture film, "Gold Placer Mines of the West", at all meetings. These meetings will be open to the public and there will be no admission charge.

Safety Sonnets

If a person has an earnest desire to commit suicide while driving his automobile, a time-tested method is to drive upon a railroad track in front of a roaring passenger train, according to Secretary of State Earl Snell.

Yet while a high proportion of fatalities result from accidents in which locomotives strike automobiles which drive in front of them, approximately half of all grade crossing accidents result from the automobile's running into the train. This type of mishap is especially common at night when visibility is poor.

Last summer a truck driver was crushed to death and his truck badly wrecked when he drove it into the side of a train of flat cars

which was standing at a crossing, after dusk. The year before another driver was killed when he drove past 13 automobiles stopped at a grade crossing and crashed into the side of a slowly-moving freight train. This accident also occurred at night.

Watchfulness and caution should be the rule at grade crossings, because trains which are moving fast cannot be stopped in time to avoid trouble, even though the engineer may see the approaching automobile.

Lamb, Well Driller

It makes no difference what problems you may have along these lines, you can depend upon the advice and information of these experts. In the early days we formed pools or basins in which to collect water screened through the sand and gravel. Then with the aid of bucket and rope we would bring it to the surface for drinking and cooking. In time we discovered that such wells also drained matter from the top soil and germs soon filled our well, so instead of drinking health we were soon drinking disease.

In addition to well drilling, Mr. E. D. Lamb does prospect drilling. Dredge operators hire him for drilling on tests to bed rock. This entails extra equipment not owned by a small well driller, as he has to have shorter casing and different buckets for miner's drilling tests. Wolf Creek people know him.

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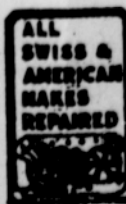
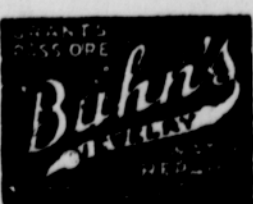
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
