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Annual Meeting of The First Church of Christ, Scientist, Boston, Mass.

Thousands of Christian Scientists, meeting in this city, challenged a troubled world to change its perspective from a material to a spiritual basis in its search for release from pressing economic and political problems.

The occasion for the great influx of the followers of Mary Baker Eddy was the annual meeting of The Mother Church, The First Church of Christ, Scientist, in Boston, Massachusetts, which was filled at an early hour in the afternoon right up to the center balcony under the very dome of the great edifice. Through an entire afternoon's round of addresses and reports from the field, the power of the Christ Truth, to lift individuals above the ills of human sense was acknowledged and this same spiritual power was recommended for the healing of the nations and the establishment of a permanent world peace.

Locking beneath the surface ripples of troubled international relationships apparent in the world today, The Christian Science Board of Directors saw the deep-running

currents of spiritual progress "keeping alive the vital realization of spiritual truth which Christian Scientists must always nurture, whether their work be along the specific line of healing or in the important channels connected with home, church, business and government."

Various reports heard during the afternoon cited specific instances of spiritual enlightenment actively at work among the nations today. One revealed that Europe, seething center of turbulent political upheavals, is also a fertile field for spiritual growth, indicated in the formation of 21 new branch church organizations abroad, 12 of them being in England.

Similar progress was reported in North America where 25 new branch organizations were launched.

FOUR HUNDRED PERCENT PROFIT PATRIOTS THE "LIBERTY LEAGUE"

March 3rd, 1935, a vast throng gathered in Sinai Temple, Chicago, to listen to an address by Sen. Gerald Nye of N. Dakota on "The Inside Story of the Munition Investigation". I am using his address as the basis of my remarks, excepting as pertaining to the Liberty League which did not enter into his discourse.

The Liberty League, sponsored by the Duponts, bitterly oppose the Townsend Plan. For a moment let us peer into the names of a few of these members of their "patriotic League". I am not opposed to wealth or those who have it provided it has not been wrung from the blood of our fellow men. Here we give just a few members and what they have donated to the League.

Lamont Dupont donated \$15,000
René Dupont donated \$86,750
Henry B. Dupont donated \$15,000
H. H. Lock Dupont donated \$15,000
William Dupont donated \$15,000
Pierre S. Dupont donated \$15,000
John J. Baskob donated \$15,000
Alfred E. Sloane donated \$15,000

In other words we might call this league a "League of millionaires". The Duponts have donated to its cause more generously than all others. We find listed fifteen members of the Dupont family that have made millions from instruments of death, from the blood of all the nations and particularly our American boys.

Now as to the patriotism of these Duponts. As to the sacrifices they stood ready to make when war broke out between the United States and the Central Powers in Europe.

"Their patriotism is dollar patriotism. But oh, how they do resent that: for weeks we had four members of the Dupont family under oath before our committee and they smarted and burned every time a finger of scorn was pointed in their direction criticizing their

profit out of four years of war. A measly paltry of 400 per cent upon their invested capital. Yes, that's all they could get out of four years of world war, 400 per cent."

"During this same war the government went to the Duponts a pleading for more capacity to produce powder, and it said to the Duponts—

"We want you to build the Old Hickory Powder Plant for us. We would like you to supervise it for us and make it produce after it is completed. We will furnish you with the money to accomplish the project. We will reward you for building this plant. And then we will repay you well for operating the plant. But please do it. The emergency is upon us. We must have this additional capacity. What did the Duponts do when their Government came with this request? Did they do what so many others did when the Government said 'Come. We need your service. Here's your uniform. We will pay you a dollar and a quarter per day.' Were the Duponts like you in that regard? No! For over three months with the nation at war the Duponts quibbled and refused to do what the Government asked of

them. Why? It was a difference of opinion as to what the Duponts margin of profit should be for constructing and operating this plant.
