War Doesn't Hinder Travel in Canada

There are no changes in regula-

tions for United States citizens entering Canada now that that country is at war, according to the Oregon State Motor association. Many inquiries on the subject have come to the association. In answer to these inquiries and since under present conditions an over-zealous inspector might be somewhat exacting in demanding proof of U. S. citizenship, the association offers several suggestions, which, if observed, will insure motorists against unnecessary delay at the border.

Firstly, it will be helpful, for example, to have handy some proof of his citizenship, such as birth certificate, automobile club membership or a bank letter. If not

natural born U. S. citizen a motorist should have for presentation his naturalization certificate, passport or other proof of U. S. citizenship.

In addition, as usual, the following information will be essential at all ports of entry:

- Name of manufacturer of car.
- Manufacturer's serial and engine number.
- Style and value of car.
- License number.
- Number of extra tires.
- Signature and address of owner.
- Sufficient cash for duration of intended stay in Canada.

Social Security and Old Age Insurance Explained

Existence of confusion in the minds of Oregonians regarding the different sections of the Social Security Act, especially unemployment compensation and old age insurance, was recognized by officials of the state commission following a review of recent correspondence received in the central office here.

Although social security account numbers are used for identification and record keeping in both systems they are entirely separate and distinct, it was pointed out.

"Many claimants for unemployment compensation believe their right to job insurance is based on deductions from their wages for that purpose," said Administrator Silas Gaiser. "This is a mistaken assumption, since the worker pays nothing for unemployment compensation in Oregon, and any deductions from his wages are for the old age insurance program."

Only the employer contributes to the Oregon unemployment compensation fund. Not only is no contribution required from the worker, but any deductions from his wages for this purpose whether made directly or indirectly, is expressly prohibited under the law.

The unemployment compensation program is administered by the state. The federal government assumes every cent of administrative costs. The old age benefits program, on the other hand, taxes both worker and employer, and is administered by the federal government.

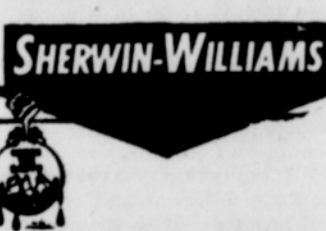
