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ANNUAL MEETING OF THE FIRST CHURCH OF CHRIST, SCIENTIST, BOSTON, MASS., JUNE 3, 1940

BOSTON, Mass., June 3.—An appeal for calm and more faith in the omnipotence of God in the face of present world turmoil featured the gathering here today of thousands

of Christian Scientists from all over the world for the annual meeting of The First Church of Christ, Scientist, in Boston, Massachusetts.

"Trusting in the omnipotence of God," said Harry C. Browne, First Reader of The Mother Church in reading a message from The Christian Science Board of Directors, "enables one, through demonstration, to enjoy the freedom of thought resulting from the unfolding of the characteristics of divine Mind as expressed by Christ Jesus."

"Becoming cognizant of the true idea about anything, exposes its suppositional opposite as a lie. Therefore, when the true idea of man's relationship to God is universally expressed, misunderstandings between men and nations will vanish."

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"The divine Mind is in reality the only power; therefore nothing can resist the manifestation of righteousness. With due regard for the necessary human footsteps which our Leader, Mary Baker Eddy, says are indispensable in meeting problems, it is also imperative to look to the divine Mind for guidance and wisdom to supply the impetus to do all things in a right way and at the right time."

Unity Divine Might

Commenting on the turbulent international situation, the incoming president said that "Christian Science reveals the power of individual man to meet and overcome the hordes of mesmeric suggestions and subtle influences claiming to induce discouragement and apathy. It enables the Christian Scientists to overcome the belief that war can be of permanent advantage, or that it is to be feared. It destroys the desire for an unrighteous, unjust, and enslaving peace; and it sets right that wrong sense of values which would prefer this so-called peace to that active warfare between the flesh and Spirit which The Mother Church typifies, and which ultimates in the victory of spirituality and Love."

Referring to the apparent strength of unity or quality in material organization, she quoted Mrs. Eddy's statement in Miscellaneous Writings (p. 138): "I once thought that in unity was human strength; but have grown to know that human strength is weakness,—that unity is divine might, giving to human power, peace."

In a parallel vein, George Shaw Cook, the retiring President, pointed out that "the effort of the individual or nation to dominate others, or to exploit them, by means of force, coercion, dishonesty, or deception, may appear temporarily to succeed, but it cannot permanently prosper for the simple reason that evil has no divine Principle. Its nature is self destructive."

"The ultimate triumph of good is not merely a question of hope or even of faith. All that is good in human experience is upheld by divine or spiritual law. And this law is able to assert itself and enforce itself, in spite of the effort of misguided mortals to interfere with or to prevent its operation."

Chub Minnows Destroy Many Trout In State

Fishermen carrying chub minnows for use as bait in lakes of Oregon planted exclusively to trout are not only violating the law but, perhaps unknowingly aiding a definite threat to trout life of these lakes, according to officials of the Oregon State Game Commission.

Chubs are of a cannibalistic type and therefore prey on other fish, destroying them in large numbers. During recent years numerous fishermen have carried chub minnows to the trout lakes, using them for bait and in some instances dumped surplus bait into the lakes. State Police Sergeant Ed Walker stopped a fisherman two years ago

who was just in the act of dumping a bucketful of chub minnows in Diamond Lake.

Under provisions of the game code, it is unlawful to fish with minnows in any waters other than those from which the minnows come. All sportsmen are urged to cooperate with the game commission in preventing the use of chub minnows in exclusive trout lakes of the state and thus aid in the preservation of game fishing in these lakes.

CHRISTIAN SCIENCE CHURCHES

This creation consists of the unfolding of spiritual ideas and their identities, which are embraced in the infinite Mind and forever reflected. These ideas range from the infinitesimal to infinity, and the highest ideas are the sons and daughters of God" (P. 502).

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A Dollar-Bright House for a Dollar a Day



A HOUSE for a dollar a day!
The Federal Housing Administration and the American building industry, which are fostering a nation-wide campaign to make it possible for families with even the most modest incomes to own bright, new, thoroughly modern houses, have built these two small demonstration houses at the New York World's Fair.

The house on the left, with four rooms and bath, cost \$2,500 to build, exclusive of lot, while the slightly larger house on the right cost \$3,100 to build. Total cost of carrying the smaller of the two, including amortization and interest on a long term FHA mortgage,

taxes and insurance, should total only about \$1.00 a day, or \$30.00 a month.

Despite this almost unbelievably low cost, the houses have been constructed with the best of modern building materials. The sides of one house have been covered with asbestos-cement siding—the other with painted wood clapboards, while both houses have been roofed with fire-resistant and colorful asphalt shingles. Both have employed full-thick mineral wool insulation.

During each of the 24 weeks of the Fair, two typical American families, representing each of the 48 states, will occupy the houses. They have been selected by newspaper contests held throughout the country. Actual construction of houses based on these demonstration house plans, is already under way in many parts of the country by private builders. They are convincing proof that the building industry can provide decent, modern houses for America's millions.
