Military Service Thursday For Art Shoemaker

Military services and burial were held at the Gold Hill cemetery this (Thursday) morning, July 25, for Arthur E. Shoemaker, well known Gold Hill resident and barber for the past six years.

Mr. Shoemaker took his own life some time after midnight Thursday at 2 o'clock Thursday and was last seen Thursday night at midnight. Although Mr. Shoemaker had left no note it is believed he had become depressed by war news and over ill health. Mr. Shoemaker had hanged himself with a piece of wire.

The body was found on the beacon hill about a half mile above town, Tuesday afternoon by Mr. Shoemakers two sons Buzz and Junior and Jim Martin.
