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February 1 Deadline For New U. S. Car Tax

Beginning February 1, all motorists will be required to pay a federal use tax of \$5 per vehicle as a result of inclusion of this new form of taxation in the Review Act of 1941, according to Dr. E. B. McDaniel, President of the Oregon State Motor Association.

Dr. McDaniel said that the U. S. Treasury and Bureau of Internal Revenue are now working out details for collection of the new tax from owners of some 32,000,000 motor vehicles.

"Our latest information is that

the Federal Bureau of Internal Revenue has decided to collect the new Federal tax through their local office set up. Master lists of car owners will be set up for each district and car owners will be notified when the tax is payable. Revenue stickers will be attached to the car when the tax is paid. As we understand it, no post office or other outside agency will be used in the collection set up.

He pointed out that penalties are provided for owners of motor vehicles who, after the effective date of the new tax, permit the use of their vehicles before payment of the tax. The A.A.A. club executive added:

"On the effective date of the tax, February 1, 1942, all owners of vehicles will be required to pay the tax for the period from February 1 to July 1, or five-twelfths of \$5.00. Then on July 1, they will pay the tax for a full year and will be due on that date for a yearly period for such time as it is levied."

"One theory of the sponsors of the use tax was that it would make people more tax conscious. It was frankly conceded that the new levy was imposed in lieu of an increase in the gasoline tax."

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Anglers May Still Fish For Trout over 10 Inches

Although the general trout season closed on October 15, anglers may fish for trout ten inches or over in coastal streams. From now until December 31, 1941, the daily bag limit for trout in tidewater will be 15 fish or fifteen pounds. After January 1, 1942, the bag limit on trout 10 inches or over will be 3 fish a day.

Above tidewater, the bag limit for trout 10 inches or over will be three trout a day. This limit is provided in order that fishermen angling for steelhead or salmon will be protected if they should accidentally land a trout above tidewater.

Steelhead and salmon, fifteen inches or over, may be taken at all times of the year, below and above tidewater.

These regulations, of course, do not apply to any stream that is closed entirely to fishing.

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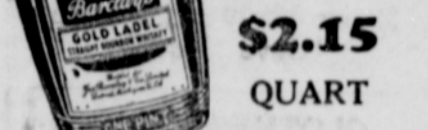
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
