## Scientific Party Finds Huge Caves Exist in Arizona

Newly discovered evidence that northern Arizona has subterranean caverns that rival in size the world famous Mammoth Caves of Kentucky and the Carlsbad Caverns of

New Mexico is stirring considerable interest among tourists as well as scientists.

The discovery, which promises to be the Southwest's most important 'find' of the century, was made recently by a scientific expedition sponsored by Edsel Ford and TWA Airline.

Existence of the enormous caverns was confirmed as the expedition investigated 38 craters situated on a hooked delta in a desolate area 20 miles south of Winslow, Arizona.

Dr. Harvey H. Nininger, curator of Denver Museum and a world-renowned meteorite authority, who headed the expedition, said a 10,000,000 ton meteorite which crashed to earth in northern Arizona 25,000 years ago created the craters by collapsing rock roofs of large underground caverns. The craters are located between Chevalon and Wild Cat Canyons, 42 miles southeast of giant Meteor Crater.

The expedition was organized after Capt. H. H. Holloway, TWA

Stratoliner pilot on the Los Angeles - Albuquerque division, had sighted the 38 craters. He discussed his theory that the huge pits were connected with Meteor Crater with Edsel Ford last summer when the Ford Motor Company president was flying as a passenger to Detroit.

At first it was thought the craters were caused by fragments from the large meteorite as it struck the earth with terrific impact. Many believed the craters were 'solution' pits or sink holes caused by subterranean rivers.

After viewing the terrain from the air and then making extensive ground surveys, Dr. Nininger revealed to newspapermen the existence of underground caverns.

My theory is that a majority of the caverns still exist, and that openings to them probably will be found in deep canyons on both sides of the 18 square mile crater area we investigated, Dr. Nininger said.

When the 10,000,000 ton meteorite smashed to earth, forming Meteor Crater, a terrible earthquake was set in motion. This collapsed the cavern roofs at their weakest points, producing the jagged pits. Had the cities of Winslow and Flagstaff been standing at the time, every building would have been demolished by the impact. Even Phoenix, 160 airline miles to the south, would have been damaged severely. If the region was inhabited at the time, every living thing within at least 50 miles would have perished.

The meteorite material in the giant Meteor Crater has been assayed as 90 per cent iron 7 per cent nickel and 3 per cent precious metals. Engineers, however, have never been able to find a method to mine it. The nickel alone is estimated to be worth \$300,000,000.

### OREGON LICENSE COLORS EXCLUSIVE DURING 1942

Oregon will have the exclusive white on dark blue license color for 1942 according to the Oregon State Motor association which has just received a compilation of colors to be seen on new automobile plates. The only competition will come from the providences of British Columbia and Alberta in Canada and the Canal Zone which also have decided to use white letters on blue backgrounds.

Washington will reverse its present combination in 1942 using green letters on a white plate; California will have orange on black; Idaho, royal blue on light grey; and Montana, white on black.

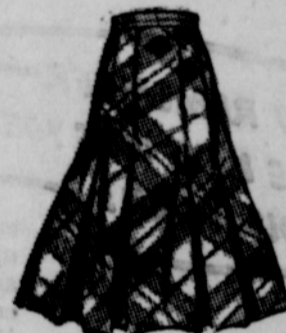
