OREGON. Oregon has been nearly thirty years in the Union; it is one of the finest States the Union contains; it is larger than Minnesota, Kansas or Nebraska, and nearly twice as large as Wisconsin or Iowa; it has a fertile soil, magnificently watered and timbered; it has access to an ocean on one side and a continent on the other; its climate is unsurpassed; it grows the finest wheat in the world, and the straightest and tallest trees for masts; it has noble fisheries and exceedingly promising coal fields, and yet with all these advantages, it has only a population of some 200,000, one-half as many as Dakota one-third as many as Nebraska, one-fourth as many as Kansas or Minnesota, and one-seventh as many as Iowa. Why is this?

The Senate Minority report recites the work of the sub-committee in hearing statements, arguments and appeals of manufacturers and others who demand that the present high rate of tariff taxation shall be maintained, and in most instances prompted, not by revenue necessities, but alone for the purpose of increasing their own profits at the expense of 60,000,000 taxpayers.

A very prolific locality for newspapers is Washington Territory. Lately we have received one each week of "Vol. 1, No. 1," of some new sheet. The latest is the "Yakima Democrat," just started at North Yakima. Some of the others are apparently published in "towns" which have very few inhabitants.

REPUBLICAN PAPERS are having a great deal to say about Kilgore, a Texas Congressman who has objected to the bill granting a pension to Mrs. Sheridan. They are not careful not to mention the fact that Chendle, a Republican Congressman, has been as much of an objector as Kilgore.

TURNER & CREW'S large safe was removed to-day to its new quarters in the Association block, the process being watched with considerable interest. Much speculation was indulged in as to how much damage would be done should the rope break and the safe fall heavily down stairs on the inclined plane, but the rope didn't break, and the safe didn't fall, and many spectators were doubtless disappointed.
