BEWARE OF '92.

A great many men in this State, more of them workmen of one sort or another, and among them many Republicans, have for years deprecated the influx of Chinese cheap laborers upon our shores.

To all such, whatever their politics, we desire—not to make any argument—but merely to state four simple facts.

1. The present exclusion law, known as the Scott law, is only amendatory of and supplemental to the ten-year restriction law which was passed in 1882, and which will expire by limitation in August, 1892.

2. On that date—August, 1892—and for nearly seven months thereafter, either Mr. Cleveland or Mr. Harrison will be the President of the United States, and can either approve or reject such a bill.

3. President Cleveland will sign such a bill. 4. Mr. Harrison—or President Harrison—will not.

The last two facts are derived from the acts and words of the two men. Mr. Harrison voted against every phase and feature of the Chinese restriction bills in the Senate, and in a public speech advocated the naturalization of Chinamen.

Mr. Cleveland, it is charged by Republican papers, and not denied, was instrumental in devising and passing the Scott law. This law represents his sentiments in the matter.

Either Minister Lord Lionel Sackville West, etc., etc., was a fool, or else, representing the interests of his government, he intended by his letter to do Cleveland an injury.

Ma. S. B. ROGERS, of Portland, a life-long Republican, was one of the speakers at a Democratic meeting in that city Tuesday evening.
